She asked that this issue be looked at and move this forward either by Ordinance or State Law.

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IX. COUNCIL PRESIDENT COMMUNICATIONS

APPOINTMENT OF *COUNCILWOMAN LUCIANO* AS VICE-CHAIR OF CLAIMS COMMITTEE

Vice President Pelletier announced appointment of Councilwoman Luciano as Vice-Chair of Claims Committee.

Mr. Cordy stated that there is a new owner, who has met with the Mayor and Building Inspector and the owner has been made aware of the City's expectations.

FIRE COMMAND ASSISTANCE TO THE TOWN OF JOHNSTON – Report from Administration

Ms. Schutt stated that as to the injured on duty, this is a questions. She asked that Chief Gumbley address this issue.

Councilman Navarro stated that if we have Mutual Aid, he asked why the Mayor made an agreement with Johnston to send our Chief there if needed. Ms. Schutt stated that this is a Mutual Aid situation. Our Fire Chief would go to Johnston when they need a Fire Chief for an issue. Councilman Navarro stated that, to him, it sounds like a political situation and he would hate to see Cranston get involved in this.

Chief Gumbley stated that Mr. Valetta is correct, Cranston has given numerous concessions to the City and Johnston does have labor dispute, but if Johnston has a fire and they need help, we should help. That is Mutual Aid. Johnston is working on hiring a Chief within the next month.

Councilman Santamaria stated that if Johnston has a fire, he has no problem with Mutual Aid, but with the Chief going into Johnston, that is more then Mutual Aid. We are just getting involved in a labor dispute.

Councilman Archetto stated that he is very reluctant to get involved in a labor dispute or political scene with Johnston.

Councilman Favicchio asked if we give administrative help or command staff help to other cities and towns. Chief Gumbley stated that this is unusual for a Chief to give help. Normally, it would be a ladder truck giving Mutual Aid.

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X. COUNCIL MEMBER COMMUNICATIONS

COUNCIL VICE-PRESIDENT PELLETIER:

Police & Fire False alarm fees - report from Administration on allocation of fees.

Ms. Schutt stated that we have collected \$42,575 for Police False Alarm and \$3,500 for Fire False Alarm. These are not restricted revenue accounts.

COUNCILMAN STYCOS:

Zoning code revisions - Status report from Administration

Ms. Schutt stated that the Building Inspector and the Planning Director are midway through the definition phase. It may take a few more months to complete.

Waste Management no bin no pickup policy – Report from Administration

Ms. Schutt stated that in regards to the January 31st report of no pickup in the Fairview area, as indicated by Councilman Stycos at the Committee meeting, she checked with Waste Management and they indicated to her that this was because the truck couldn't get down the street due to the snow. Waste Management provides her with a list of streets that they did not pick up and why and stickers are placed on the bins indicating why their trash was not picked up.

COUNCILMAN STYCOS:

Tax Assessment Board of Review

Councilman Stycos asked what the process is of how the members of this Board receives their stipend. Ms. Schutt stated that she believes the Assessor notifies payroll. Councilman Stycos indicated that this Board met last week and the meeting was only for 28 minutes. City Code Section 3.08.050 specifies that the meetings should be no less than one hour according to this, they should not get paid for that meeting. Mr. Strom stated that sometimes meetings go over one hour and they still get paid the \$50. Ms. Schutt stated that the members do a lot of preparation work at home before and after the meetings, which they do not get paid for. Maybe the payment structure does need to be addressed.

Council Vice-President Pelletier stated that that meeting, the members will get paid for. That meeting was for procedural discussion of the meetings and their payment will not be held up.

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COUNCILMAN SANTAMARIA:

1590 Plainfield Circle

Councilman Santamaria asked that the Administration contact the owners of 1590 Plainfield Circle regarding sewer claim. They still do not have any answers from the City on questions or information they were asking for. Ms. Schutt stated that the residents were explained that they had to go through the Claims process.

Solicitor stated that he spoke to these people about the details they wanted from the City. He will contact them again asking for details of where the City failed them.

Illegal Sewer Tie-Ins

Councilman Santamaria questioned if there is going to be an Executive Session meeting regarding illegal sewer tie-ins. Solicitor stated that he has been in communication with Chairman of Public Works, Councilman Navarro, and there should be a date set for this meeting shortly.

COUNCILMAN SANTAMARIA:

Safe Routes to Schools – Report on allocation of funding to replace existing signs

Councilman Santamaria stated this report is in the Council's packets and no discussion is needed on this issue.

Salt Barn Update from Administration

No discussion was held. Item removed from the Docket.

COUNCILMAN ARCHETTO:

Status of Snow Removal Fund

Ms. Schutt stated that at this time, there is \$550,000 - \$600,000 overage in this fund. Councilman Archetto asked if there are any other holes in the budget at this time. Mr. Strom stated that overall, our tax collection is slightly over. Ms. Schutt stated that there are two main funds that there is an overage, Snow Removal and Lighting. The monthly financials the Council receives will show this information.
