It is ordained by the City Council of the City of Cranston as follows:

Section 1. Title 5, Chapter 68, Section 5.68.020 entitled "License Required" is hereby amended as follows:

5.68.020 - License required.

It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale, to give away, deliver or to keep with the intention of selling, giving away or delivering tobacco products within the city without having first obtained a tobacco dealer's license pursuant to this chapter. Such license shall be in addition to any other license required by state and/or federal law. Failure to obtain a license shall result in a fine of two hundred dollars (\$200.00). Fee for the city license shall be ~~(twenty-five dollars-(\$25.00))~~ two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per year.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its *final adoption.


