Russell Cucino, applicant, appeared to speak and stated that the business address is 223 Macklin St. and the majority of the work will be done on Calder St. The license is for Macklin St. and he is renting two bays between Calder St. and Macklin St. and they are not facing the residents. The oil smell is not from his shop. The hours of operation will be 8:00 AM to 5 PM Monday thru Friday and possibly 8:00 AM to 12 Noon on Saturdays.

Mr. Cucino stated that he is not doing any auto body work or auto painting and not burning anything.

Captain Morris stated that he went to the area on Friday at approximately 3:00 PM and there was no one at the two bays on 225 Macklin St. and there was no one at the two bays on the side either. He saw no evidence of work being done at this location.

Chair asked Mr. Cucino if he has been doing any work. Mr. Cucino stated that he has done some work there in the past few weeks getting it ready.

Council President Lupino stated that looking at a picture shown by Mrs. Cambio, there is a fence on Macklin St. and a fence could not be placed in front of the bays on Macklin St. Maybe this should be brought to the attention of the Zoning Board of Review.

Council President Lupino asked if an assessment has been done in that area as to the burning of waste oil. Captain Morris stated that there is one business he is aware of that burns waste oil, which he has inspected.

On motion by Councilman Archetto, seconded by Councilman Santamaria, it was voted to deny this license application.

Under Discussion:

Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that there may be two issues at this property. It is not fair that this applicant take on unreasonable burden of every business that has been at this property. This application is consistent with the Zoning granted in 1972. The real issue appears to be the property owner. If the Committee feels the property owner has shirked his responsibility, a referral can be made to the Housing Board to make an inspection and bring this property up to Code.
