## **REGULAR MEETING – CITY COUNCIL**

**-NOVEMBER 26, 2012-**

Regular meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, November 26, 2012 in the Council Chambers, City Hall, Cranston, Rhode Island.

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 P.M. by the Council President.

Roll call showed the following members present: Councilwoman Luciano, Councilmen Donahue, Stycos, Archetto, Councilwoman Bucci (left meeting at 9:10 p.m.), Councilmen Santamaria, Favicchio, Council Vice-President Navarro and Council President Lupino -9.

On motion by Councilman Donahue, seconded by Councilman Favicchio, it was voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and they stand approved as recorded. Motion passed on a vote of 9-0. **John DiBona, Esq.**, appeared to represent Picerne Investments Corp. The applicant Ordinance 10-12-5 and stated that at the last meeting, concerns were stated of trash, traffic, among others. If this is approved this evening, this would be the first step in a process the project would have to undergo. This would have to go through Development Plan Review stage and all these concerns will be addressed through the site plan review process.

**John DiBona, Esq.**, appeared to represent applicant for Night Owl Restaurant Group LLC Class BV License application.

**Wayne Kazarian, Esq.**, appeared to represent Johnson & Wales regarding Abandonment of Harborside Blvd.

**Former Council President Aram Garabedian**, 173 Belvedere Dr., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 9-12-3 and stated that chickens will attract rats. He urged the Council not to pass this Ordinance and to review materials currently available from the City of Providence. He also urged the Mayor to try to find a way to obtain all information to solve the pension issues with the Police and Fire retirees.

**Dennis DiBella** of Friends of Animals, appeared to regarding Ordinance 9-12-3 and stated that chickens present significant health issues for young children and that they also draw coyotes, rats and raccoons.

**Wendy Rainoso**, 161 Shaw Ave., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 9-12-3. She stated that she has chickens and is very responsible in keeping food in a safe area. This Ordinance lays out standards for keeping chickens.

**Kim Morin**, 150 Quail Hollow Rd., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 9-12-3 and stated that this Ordinance sets guidelines on the construction of coops and also the feeding.

**Council Member-Elect and former Council President John Lanni**, 111 Woodview Dr., appeared to speak regarding Ordinance 9-12-3 and stated that this Ordinance is contradictory. A few months ago, the Council passed an Ordinance limiting one bird feeder per household and now this would be allowing ten chickens per household. There is also an enforcement problem with this Ordinance. He also addressed the Police and Fire Ordinances and stated that in 2003, the then City Council and Mayor tried to pass similar Ordinances and the City lost in Court. This is like history repeating itself. He urged the Mayor, City Council and future City Council to work with all the parties to come up with a solution.

**Ray Patten**, 1097 Phenix Ave., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 9-12-3 and stated that this is a strong Ordinance.

**Wendy Mill**, 84 Richard St., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 9-12-3.

**Veronica Brown**, 36 Mill Rd., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 10-12-5.

**Russ Chatenauf**, 40 Nickerson St., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 10-12-5.

**Council Member-Elect Sara Lee**, 131 Shaw Ave., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 9-12-3.

**Paul Pelagian**, 53 Nickerson St., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 10-12-5. he stated the following concerns: traffic 24-7, pollution & trash, property values would be effected, hours of operation would be totally different then what is there now.

**Melody Cassell**, 206 Station St., Coventry, former Cranston Police Officer, appeared to oppose to Police and Fire Pension Ordinances. She stated that she retired with a contract, which the City Council ratified. The proposed Ordinances are not just a violation of contract law, but also constitutional law.

**Mayor Fung** appeared to speak and stated that he was just advised that there are enough retirees who are willing to discuss a resolution to make the solution a feasible option. In light of this, he is withdrawing the two proposed Ordinances on police and fire pensions.

**John Ennis, Esq.**, appeared to represent Garrett Brown, who is an abutter to the Zone Change application for Ordinance 10-12-5 and is opposed to this Zone Change.

**Jeffrey Michaelson, Esq.**, appeared to represent Bonefish Grill regarding Class BV license application.

**Councilman Archetto** stated that he also cannot support this Ordinance because there will be people who will not keep chickens properly and significantly contribute to the rodent issue. He also questioned what the cost is going to be to the City to enforce this.

**Council President Lupino** stated that this was a well-crafted Ordinance. The Committee added requirements for the construction of the coops. He does not think it will create the abuses stated by other Council members.

**Councilman Donahue** stated that he agrees with Council President Lupino that it is a well-written Ordinance. We are moving in the direction that people are raising their own food. This Ordinance creates a set of parameters under which households can have chickens and gives the City enforcement powers.

**Mr. Cordy** stated that attorneys representing the RI Department of Education are meeting tomorrow to work out this agreement and executed agreement should be forthcoming.
