Council President Lanni asked if this would affect catering trucks and also questioned if this Ordinance is passed, would these be temporary locations or permanent.

Chair stated that flower vendors have a 1,000 ft. radius and right now and Itinerant Food Vendors do not have a radius restriction. This Ordinance is fair and there are a lot of locations available in the City where this Ordinance would not prohibit a vendor from selling.

Councilman Favicchio suggested that maybe an amendment can be made to the Ordinance having the vendor obtain a waiver from restaurants within the 1,000 ft. radius. He also stated that we need to protect our restaurants because they pay a lot of taxes.

Councilman Stycos and Councilwoman Lee both agreed with Councilman Favicchio.

Councilman Aceto stated that he agrees that we need to protect the businesses, but maybe the 1,000 ft. rule is too much.

Council President Lanni stated that we do need to protect the businesses. They pay a lot of rent and taxes and not put them out of business. The 1,000 ft. rule does not exclude the vendor from all areas in the City. The only thing that concerns him is how the 1,000 ft. rule will be enforced.

Roll call was taken on motion to recommend approval of this Ordinance and motion passed on a vote of 6-1. The following being recorded as voting "aye": Councilmen Santamaria, Aceto, Archetto, Favicchio, Council Vice-President Farina and Council President Lanni -6. Chair stated that when this license application was originally approved, the Committee was told by the applicant that he was not going to use the bays on Macklin St. He asked Mr. Cucino if the bays on Macklin St. are being used. Mr. Cucino stated that at the time, he was not using the bays, since then, he purchased the building. He is trying to work with the neighbors. The building is zoned for it and there is just one woman who is being very hard to please. At the time, he stated that the only bays he was going to use was the ones on the side. He is cleaning up the area.

Council Vice-President Farina asked if there have been any additional complaints regarding the fence or debris. Chair stated, no.

On motion by Council Vice-President Farina, seconded by Councilman Aceto, it was voted to approve this license renewal application. Motion passed unanimously.

XII. SHOW CAUSE HEARING:

**SHOW CAUSE HEARING - NEW
2012 Sports Bar & Lounge -**

(Violation of entertainment restriction)

Gregory Piccirilli, Esq. appeared to represent the establishment.

Major Schaffran stated that on May 4, 2013 at approximately 9:40 P.M., Police responded to this establishment and found live band playing. Mr. Andrade, owner, was advised that live entertainment was in violation and Mr. Andrade ordered the band to stop playing. He indicated to the Police that he was not aware that this was prohibited. Major Schaffran stated that in 2011, the Safety Services Committee did give permission to this establishment for computerized music.

Gregory Bramble, 25 Bolton St., appeared to speak and stated that he and other residents on this street have been picking up bottles on their property, specifically on Thanksgiving morning, because this business does not clean up their property. He recommended that the Committee mandate Police detail or hire security before and after events.

Anthony Lupino, 15 Black Oak Ct., former Council President, appeared to speak and stated that there were restrictions placed on the license for this location, specifically because of the care of the Committee. The owners are responsible for their patrons. The intent of the approval of this license at this location was with restrictions.

Attorney Piccirilli objected to statements made this evening by speakers. He stated that the only issue this evening is Show Cause Hearing for violation of the entertainment restriction for live band playing on May 4th. Police were given false complaints of noise and false complaints of alcohol being sold in cans. His client does not sell alcohol in cans.

Councilman Aceto asked Attorney Piccirilli if he or his client were aware of restrictions when his client applied for license or when issued the license. Attorney Piccirilli stated that there are no restrictions listed on the license issued to his client in December of 2012. There was a restriction at the time the license was originally granted, but when the license was issued in 2012, there were no restrictions listed.

Solicitor Rawson referred to prior Safety Services minutes and stated that restrictions live on from application stage.

City Clerk stated that last year, applicant made a request for removal of restrictions and the Committee denied the request and it was appealed to the State and that appeal is still pending.

Attorney Piccirilli showed Committee members license that was issued to his client, which state no restrictions on it. City Clerk stated that whether or not the restrictions are listed on the license, this license was issued and applicant and the attorney clearly were aware of the restrictions and they had full knowledge of what the restrictions were regardless of any clerical omission.

2012 Sports Bar & Lounge**

Council Vice-President Farina asked Solicitor Rawson if restrictions stay in perpetuity until this body revokes those restrictions. Solicitor Rawson stated, yes.

Councilwoman Lee asked if there is any requirement where restrictions have to be listed on the license on display in the business. City Clerk stated that there is not, it has been a practice she implemented as City Clerk. The restrictions are placed on the license more for the benefit of the police for enforcement if there is an issue.

Councilman Favicchio stated that this Committee is not trying to put this business out of business or revoke the license. The Committee is trying to send a message that applicant has to adhere to restrictions. He clearly remembers testimony from the meeting at which this license was approved that there would be no live entertainment.

Council President Lanni indicated that the no live entertainment restriction is approximately five years old and has gone through two owners at this location. This applicant was told about this restriction when he purchased this business.

Attorney Piccirilli indicated that when this Committee refused to lift the restriction last year, a pre-hearing was held at the State Liquor Board and it was made clear that the restriction was specifically in violation of Section 3-77-3 of State Law, unless it is done in an Ordinance form. Both the City Clerk and the Solicitor were present at this hearing and he would think the Solicitor would have advised the City that they could not place such a restriction on the license. When his client received the license in December, 2012, there were no restrictions listed on it and they understood that the restrictions had been lifted and they have been operating since December with that understanding. This is why the Police did not issue a citation on May 4th because when they saw the license, it did not list any restrictions on it.

Council President Lanni stated that this Committee has several options: it could have the applicant re-apply and officially list the restriction on the license or the Committee can fine the applicant or close them down for a number of days.

On motion by Council President Lanni, seconded by Councilwoman Lee, it was voted to impose a \$1,000 fine on this establishment and next time this happens, the license will be revoked.

Attorney Piccirilli indicated to Section 1.08.010 of the City Code limiting the fines to \$200.

Chair indicated to RIGL 3-77-3, which states “may restrict” and stated that the Solicitor has indicated to him that this Committee is not restricted to \$200.

Roll call was taken on motion to fine applicant \$1,000 and next time this happens, license will be revoked and motion passed on a vote of 7-0. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Santamaria, Aceto, Archetto, Favicchio, Councilwoman Lee, Council Vice-President Farina and Council President Lanni -7.

Chair indicated that fine is to be paid tomorrow.
