

(The following is not a verbatim transcript of comments or discussion that occurred during the meeting, but rather a summarization intended for general informational purposes. All motions and votes are the official records).

SAFETY SERVICES & LICENSES COMMITTEE

Regular meeting of the Safety Services and Licenses Committee was held on Monday, October 7, 2013 in the Council Chambers, City Hall, Cranston, Rhode Island.

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 P.M. by the Chair.

II. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:

On motion by Council Vice-President Farina, seconded by Councilman Favicchio, it was voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and they stand approved as recorded. Motion passed unanimously.

III. CORRESPONDENCE:

Letter from Walmart re: expanding regular hours for the year until midnight instead of 11PM

On motion by Council President Lanni, seconded by Council Vice-President Farina, it was voted to deny the request to remain open until midnight as normal business hours and also to restrict the 24-hours to Thanksgiving Eve and Christmas Eve.

Under Discussion:

Justin Britney, Manager of Wal-Mart, appeared to speak and stated that Wal-Mart was approved for 24-hours from Thanksgiving to Christmas last year. He questioned why the Committee is placing restriction this year.

William Marocco, Westfield Dr., appeared to speak and stated that there is activity going on at this business even after hours. There is no need for them to be open 24-hours a day. This is in a residential neighborhood.

Barbara Sodder, nearby resident, appeared to speak and is opposed to the requests being made by Wal-Mart.

Carol Sodder, Westfield Dr., appeared to speak and stated that there is no need for a 24-hour operation.

Motion to deny request for extension of hours passed unanimously.

On motion by Council President Lanni, seconded by Councilwoman Lee, it was voted to approve two days for 24-hours, Black Friday at 12 A.M. and Christmas Eve until 8:00 P.M. Motion passed unanimously.

IV. OLD BUSINESS:

2012 Sports Bar and Lounge

Review of Restrictions pursuant to DBR Order

Gregory Piccirilli, Esq., 121 Phenix Ave., appeared to represent establishment.

Lisa Bessette, 116 Mendon Ave., Pawtucket, owner of 2012 Sports Bar, appeared to speak and gave history of this business from the time they were granted license two years ago to the present.

Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that this Committee has passed an Ordinance setting specific requirements with regards to Entertainment Licenses.

Attorney Piccirilli stated that the Ordinance passed contains requirements that can't possibly be complied. As far as he knows, the Ordinance has not been approved by Department of Business Regulations.

Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that he notified Attorney Piccirilli last week that he had not heard from Department of Business Regulations and has had no negative feedback from Department of Business Regulations after submitting it.

Attorney Piccirilli asked Councilman Aceto, who stated at a past meeting that "because of one bad apple, this Ordinance needs to be passed", to recuse himself. He assumes he was speaking of his client. He also asked Councilmen Santamaria, Archetto and Council President Lanni to recuse – Councilman Archetto stated at past meeting "his client does not know how to do things the right way" and Council President Lanni stated "his client's father is demented".

Chair asked opinion from Mr. Quinlan regarding this request by Attorney Piccirilli. Mr. Quinlan stated that his opinion is that he does not believe these Council members have to recuse. If the Council members can fairly grant a fair and unbiased hearing and vote on this issue, they do not need to recuse themselves. If they feel they can't be unbiased, then they should recuse.

Ms. Bessette was sworn in for Solicitor Kirshenbaum to ask questions.

Solicitor Kirshenbaum asked Ms. Bessette:

- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Are the people who are owners of the business the same as the ones when first applied? Ms. Bessette: Yes.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Hours of operation? Ms. Bessette: They are open seven days a week from Monday thru Saturday 7:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. and Sundays from 1:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: What type of Entertainment is being proposed? Ms. Bessette: Sundays, they would have Calamari Brothers from 8:00 P.M. to 12:00 P.M.; Mondays and Tuesdays, they have jukebox and Monday Night Football; Wednesdays they have Karaoke Oldies music from 7:00 P.M. to 11:00 P.M. or midnight; Thursdays they have Karaoke for general public from 8:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. and Fridays and Saturdays they have either regular music playing from computer hooked up to sound system or live music from 8:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Are managers the same as the ones who applied initially? Ms. Bessette: Yes.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Is there a floor plan submitted to the City Clerk? Ms. Bessette: Yes, it was submitted when they first applied.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Do you have a license in any other city? Ms. Bessette: No.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Do you own the building? Ms. Bessette: No.

Ms. Bessette indicated that they sometimes have a comedian from 9:00 P.M. to 9:30 P.M. and 11:30 P.M. to 1:00 A.M.

- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Is there a lease? Ms. Bessette: Yes. Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Is it on file with the City? Ms. Bessette: Yes.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Have you read the proposed Ordinance which has been passed regarding Entertainment License? Ms. Bessette: Yes.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Have you met with the Police Department with respect to the Entertainment License being requested for? Ms. Bessette: No.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Have you had an Entertainment License in any other City? Ms. Bessette: No.

- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Has anyone associated with the business had an Entertainment License in any other City? Ms. Bessette: Her brother had an Entertainment License in Pawtucket several years ago. Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Were there any violations cited with regards to that business? Ms. Bessette: Not that she is aware of.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: How many parking spaces do you have available for your business? Ms. Bessette: approximately 36.
- Solicitor Kirshenbaum: Are the hours set in stone or is there a flexibility if the Council has concerns? Ms. Bessette: They are pretty much set in stone because it is in keeping in mind with what other businesses are doing in the neighborhood.

Council President Lanni asked if this Committee can restrict the type of music this establishment has. Attorney Piccirilli stated that this may violate the First Amendment Rule. Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that if the applicant agrees not to have a certain type of music, the Committee may be able to hold them to that.

Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that the applicant needs to go through the Police Department and Fire Department to review floor plan and also have Zoning review the parking plan.

Chair asked if applicant would be willing to adjust the hours to possibly 10:00 P.M. every night. Attorney Piccirilli asked if all other establishments will be restricted to those hours also. Chair indicated that this Committee can restrict hours as a Committee. Attorney Piccirilli stated that this is not a standard and it would violate the Department of Business Regulation's Rule. Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that it would depend on the situations and other circumstances. Standards in the Ordinance will be applied to each applicant. Ms. Bessette stated that reducing the hours of operation would be detrimental to her business.

Councilman Favicchio motioned to approve lifting the restrictions, subject to approval of Police, Fire and any other approvals needed. Councilman Aceto seconded the motion.

Under Discussion:

Council President Lanni stated that by approving this, this Committee can't tell the applicant what type of music they can have on the premises. This presents a problem to him. We also can't tell them what hours they can operate. There should be an agreement with the business owner. Because of this, he can't vote for lifting these restrictions.

Roll call was taken on motion to lift the restrictions and motion failed on a vote of 3-4. The following being recorded as voting "aye": Councilwoman Lee, Councilmen Favicchio and Aceto -3. The following being recorded as voting "nay": Councilmen Santamaria, Archetto, Council Vice-President Farina and Council President Lanni -4.

Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that the process is to have this item placed on the full Council Docket. He asked Attorney Piccirilli if he would like this to be placed before the full Council. Attorney Piccirilli stated that he will appeal to the Department of Business Regulations for a hearing and if they can't get a hearing in time, they will be before the full Council on October 28th.

Chair indicated that the previous business had a Beer and Wine license. This is a new business that would have to reapply as a new license.

Mr. DeMarco stated that the owners of the plaza do not have enough parking for this business and a patio is being built in the front of the building. He provided pictures of the patio being built. Chair indicated to applicant that the patio is not part of the application.

Lisa Chiu, applicant, appeared to speak and stated that the patio is being built by the landlord. It was built after they signed a lease. Chair stated that this would require an Expansion of Premise License application. Ms. Chiu stated that the patio is not for serving, it is only for aesthetics.

Mr. DeMarco stated that this patio is taking at least five to six parking spaces. There is not enough parking as it is and there will be parking on the street if this is approved. There are three dumpsters behind the building which are blocking the fire lane.

Councilman Favicchio questioned if these issues should impact the applicant. This seems to be problems between the neighbors and the landlord. Solicitor Kirshenbaum stated that this is not pertinent to the applicant's application for a business there. The neighbors should be contacting the Building Official with regards to issues with the landowner. The Building Official can cite the owner for building the patio for not going through the proper route.

Ms. Chiu stated that the hours of operation will be Mondays thru Thursdays 10:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M., Fridays and Saturdays 10:00 A.M. to 11:00 P.M. and Sundays 4:00 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. As to the parking, this is not going to be a problem because the other businesses in the plaza will be closed at night when they are open.
