Debra Assante appeared to speak.

William Dimitri, Esq. appeared to represent Ms. Assante and stated that since the last meeting, he has consulted with Ms. Assante. At this point in time, he and his client are looking for guidance, they will not object to revocation. Their issue is that they have some items that were dropped off for repair or placed on layaway and they are compiling a list of the customers. They are looking for guidance as to how to return these items and time for these items to be returned.

Chair addressed the issue of the return of these items, and asked if there could be some type of supervision by the Police Department. Solicitor O'Neill stated that something can be worked out, but there may be a conflict with having the Police supervise. He suggested the possibility of drafting a release and contact the customers and have them come to retrieve their item with some documentation.

Councilman Aceto asked how many customers are on this list. Attorney Dimitri stated that there is a list and most are repairs. He does not have a full list this evening, but his client has not been able to go into the building. There are easily over 100 items.

Chair stated that he has a problem with this being self-regulated.

Councilman Aceto stated that we could give the establishment a temporary permit for them to return these items with the Police supervision.

Attorney Dimitri stated that if there is going to be a Police Officer present every time an item is returned, he has to worry about the Fourth Amendment issue. His client is not trying to circumvent the Solicitor's Office or the Police, but he would like to come up with some sort of agreement with the Solicitor that would be agreeable with the City Council.

Council President Lanni questioned what the problem is with Police supervision. He wants to make sure correct forms are filled out and proper items are returned.

Attorney Dimitri stated that if an Officer is in the building, that would be fine, but he would be opposed to the Officer handling the items. Chair stated that he will not go along with the business handling this themselves. He asked Captain Carnevale and Detective Duffy if there would be a problem with someone to be available as a liaison during this process. Captain Carnevale stated that he will make someone available.

Chair questioned timetable for this process. Attorney Dimitri stated that a release needs to be drafted before agreeing to dates.

On motion by Councilman Farina, seconded by Council President Lanni, it was voted to continue this license renewal application to the full City Council meeting and possibly have something drafted by then.

Under Discussion:

Councilman Stycos asked who will pay for the Police Detail.

Chair asked that for the next Council meeting, the following information be provided: Solicitor have information regarding timetable and who will pay for detail and a release be drafted by the Solicitor and Attorney Dimitri.

Roll call was taken on above motion and motion passed unanimously.

Louis DeSimone, Esq. appeared to represent establishment.

Chair stated that this business was before this Committee last month and continue this license renewal application to this evening and the attorney for the business went to Department of Business Regulations regarding the Police detail. Department of Business Regulations sent this back to this Committee. Since then, there was an incident this past weekend where there were two stabbings at this establishment.

Attorney DeSimone stated that at Department of Business Regulations, he, along with the Solicitor and the Police Department agreed and it was determined that there would be detail on Saturday nights and his client had no objections to having the detail. As to the incident this past weekend, his clients are asking this Committee to permit them to voluntarily remain closed. They are looking for new security detail.

Chair asked if there was Police presence Saturday night into Sunday. Attorney DeSimone stated that his clients requested detail, but the Police could not fill it. Captain Carnevale stated that to his knowledge, no calls were made from this establishment requesting detail.

Jorge Delgaillo appeared to speak and stated that he is one of the owners.

Chair asked Mr. Delgaillo if there was Police detail every Saturday night until the September 10th incident and who called to make the request. Attorney DeSimone stated that Jorge Delgaillo's brother, Victor, called.

Victor Delgaillo appeared to speak. Chair asked Victor Delgaillo if he requested Police detail between August 12th and September 10 thru the 11th. Victor Delgaillo stated, yes. Chair asked who he spoke to. Victor Delgaillo stated that he did not remember the name of the person he spoke to.

Captain Carnevale stated that there were details starting in August until they closed down because of license issues. Once they re-opened, they never regenerated the request for detail.

Chair asked what days they were closed because of taxation issues. Jorge Delgaillo stated that they were closed August 26th, Thursday thru Sunday. Chair asked if they had detail on Labor Day weekend. Jorge Delgaillo stated, no. Chair asked why there was no detail when DBR told them they had to have detail on Saturday nights.

Council Minority Leader Favicchio stated that applicant knew that he needed detail on Saturday nights and also per DBR ruling. He questioned applicant why they did not call the Police Department to question why they did not show up or why they did not shut down. He also stated that applicant was advised at the last Safety Services meeting that if Police detail did not show up, it did not mean they were to stay open. He indicated that September 3rd was the last detail.

Councilman Farina asked if anyone called the Police Department on the Saturday night of September 10th, when detail did not show up at 10 p.m. to see why they did not show up. Jorge Delgaillo stated, no, he thought they knew they had to show up.

Chair asked whether there were Police detail on the following dates:

- August 13th ----- Jorge Delgaillo stated, yes
- August 20th ----- Jorge Delgaillo stated, yes
- August 27th ----- Jorge Delgaillo stated, no, they were closed due to tax issues
- September 3rd ----- Jorge Delgaillo stated, no
- September 10th ----- Jorge Delgaillo stated, no

Attorney DeSimone reiterated that a Captain from the Cranston Police Department, at the last meeting of this Committee, stated to him that if there was no detail, it did not mean they could not stay open.

Council President Lanni addressed the applicants and stated that this is a mess, not because of they had no detail, but they are running a business with no restraints. There have been cars broken into, riots and stabbing. This is Cranston, they are not going to operate this type of business in Cranston. He stated to the applicants that they are very close to being shut down. He is glad that they are voluntarily closing and reassessing this situation and hopefully come back to this Committee with a game plan that will fix this.

Attorney DeSimone stated that his client will be instituting a new dress code, instituting security measures, besides hiring a new security company and changing the type of music they have.

Captain Carnevale stated that he just checked with Police Headquarters and there was no detail ordered for September 3rd or the 10th. He also stated that on August 25th, the window of one of the owner's vehicle was broken into and he showed the Police Officer a video of the incident. As to the September 10th incident, one of the Officers has been trying to contact the owners for the surveillance video. Up until now, they still don't have a video. He takes offense to the fact that the owner provided video when his window was broken and now he does not care to provide the video to help the people who were stabbed.

Michael Delgaillo, one of the owners, appeared to speak and stated that he had the video of the September 10th incident and the Police took everything.

Robin Weaver appeared to speak and stated the following concerns with this establishment: cars parking and blocking entrance to Farmington Terrace, patrons smoking marijuana outside of the Farmington Terrace property and hang around for hours.

Richard Tomlins, 400 Farmington Ave., appeared to speak and stated that he spoke to former Chief and he has a litany of problems with this business ever since it was established. He does not think that they should have a liquor license. His biggest concern is having our Police there and there is an incident, we are putting our men and women in harm's way that this City Council should never allow. He strongly suggests withdrawing the approval of this license.

Council Minority Leader Favicchio asked how many people were at this establishment this past Saturday night. Jorge Delgaillo stated, approximately 105. Council Minority Leader Favicchio asked what the capacity of this establishment is. Jorge Delgaillo stated approximately 140. Council Minority Leader Favicchio asked applicants if the people who cause this incident have been in their establishment before. Jorge Delgaillo stated, no. Council Minority Leader Favicchio stated that he is very concerned with the clientele that these owners have. He asked applicants if they are offering hookah and if so, if they have a hookah license. Jorge Delgaillo stated, yes they do offer hookah and they have a license.

Jorge Delgaillo stated that there were not 50 people involved in the September 10th incident as it was reported. There were only three guys. He does not know where the 50 people came from. He apologized for the incident and are sorry. He would be willing to having Saturday detail all the time. Council Minority Leader Favicchio stated that he is not sure this will solve the problem.

On motion by Councilman Farina, seconded by Councilman Aceto, it was voted to close the business and suspend license for 30 days for review by this Committee at the next meeting and possible plan of action and \$360 fine for not having Police detail on Saturdays when they were supposed to have.

Captain Carnevale stated that the Police do have the video of the September 10th incident obtained through a search warrant.

Solicitor Rawson stated that we will try to get a Consent Judgment first then a lien can be placed on the property.
