Councilman Livingston stated that the biggest concern the applicant should have is worry about the State closing Cameron's down.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Councilman Santamaria, it was voted to continue this item for three weeks and applicant is to come up with a plan of how this property is to be divided to be in compliance with the State.

Chair stated that he spoke to Mr. DeLuca from the State today and he is not happy that no action has taken place. Chair stated that in three weeks, he would like to see a temporary plan and a partition.

Detective Russell Henry, appeared to speak and stated that he visited the establishment undercover on March 3, 2008. He stated that the establishment is advertising sale of alcohol on the menu and on March 3, 2008, he and another Detective were served beer and consumed it on premises

Councilman Santamaria stated that at the last meeting, applicant was asked to remove all alcohol from the premises. He asked if this has been done. Ms. Lee stated, yes.

Detective Henry stated that the following day, March 4, 2008, Patrol Officer went to the establishment and there was no alcohol being served. .

Councilman Barone asked if the Patrol Officer checked on the premises. Detective Henry stated that the Patrol Officer checked the serving area.

Chair asked applicant if the menu still lists alcohol. Ms. Lee stated it has been erased off.

Ms. Wall stated that there are two items before this Committee this evening, the liquor license application and the show cause hearing for serving alcohol without a license, which is in violation of State Statute and local Ordinance, which imposes a fine.

Councilman Santamaria asked Ms. Lee if her servers are certified. Ms. Lee stated, yes.

On motion by Council Member Bucci, seconded by Councilman Livingston, it was voted to have applicant re-apply in six months for a liquor license and impose \$500 fine for serving alcohol without a license. Motion passed unanimously.

Status review: Relationship with Miller's Crossing; Disorderly conduct and disturbances

Chair stated that all the licenses regarding Miller's Crossing will be discussed together.

Robert Murray, Esq., appeared to represent the applicant, Miller's Crossing. He stated that at the suggestion of the Council President, at the last meeting, his client held a meeting with the neighbors on March 24, 2008.

David Miller, applicant, appeared to speak and stated that the hours of operation are Monday thru Sunday 3:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. and he has a total of 12 employees, full and part-time. Since the last meeting, he has installed a fence along the Southern boundary of Vasa Hall, at his expense. There has been an application for Abandonment of a portion of Moon Ave. that has been filed and, if approved by the Council, this will add more parking for his business.

Attorney Murray presented two letters, one from Joseph Cataldi, who lives across the street from Vasa Hall, and one from Frank Paolino, owner of the property where CVS and Washington Trust is located.

Rick Farmani, who works across the street from this establishment. He stated that the vicinity of this business is very clean kept and very well maintained.

Sister Thereseta Donach, 253 Main St., Blackstone, Massachusetts, appeared to speak and stated that Miller's Crossing, among others, helped her raise over \$9,000 for families in need.

William Smith, 33 Stan Ave., Treasurer of Vasa Hall, appeared to speak and stated that Mr. Miller has been a great tenant and if it was not for him, Vasa Hall would not be able to continue to operate.

Appearing To Oppose:

Andrew Teitz, Esq., appeared to represent Natale Family LLC, who owns residential property across the street from this establishment. He stated that all the people who are in favor of this license are never there when this business is operating in the evening and during closing times and there are problems there at that time. He addressed Rule 9 of the Department of Business Regulations, which this applicant does not adhere to or has not adhered to since 1995. He presented Police logs of incidents that have occurred at this establishment and stated that there is a history of Police responding to this establishment, including individual Police reports of the last few weeks of this year. He also presented Police reports from the Warwick establishment, which this applicant also owns.

Councilman Santamaria asked that Attorney Teitz stick to the Cranston establishment.

Council President Garabedian stated that of all the disturbances at this establishment, he asked how many times the applicant has been fined. Council Member Bucci stated that at the last meeting, Major Blackmar indicated that there have been no incidents at this establishment.

Councilman Livingston stated that looking at these reports, it looks like most of these incidents had nothing to do with this establishment, they just occurred in this vicinity and they should not be punishing this business.

Captain Schaffran stated that Major Blackmar indicated to him that there were no incidents at this business.

Councilman Barone stated that looking at the reports, the third column states that they are low priority calls and not high where it would be an emergency.

Chair indicated that since he has been on the Council, Miller's Crossing has never been before this Committee or been fined for serving alcohol to minors or any other reasons. He asked how many detail officers have been assigned to Millers' Crossing. Attorney Murray stated that at the request of Major Blackmar, in February, the Committee requested the applicant hire a detail on Friday and Saturday evenings and last month Major Blackmar indicated that there were no incidents reported and agreed that detail was not needed and if in the future it was warranted, it would be re-instated. At this time, there are no detail.

David Achman, 59 or 55 Old Bald Hill Rd., appeared to speak and stated that there is a problem at this business. When the business is closing, people are yelling and screaming. He lives next door to the business. When the Police is called, by the time the Police arrive, the people are gone. The fence was a good idea, but there is a problem with the noise at closing time.

Michael Langlois, 55 Bald Hill Rd., appeared to speak and stated that there is no balance or fairness. Earlier in the meeting, an applicant was fined for serving alcohol without a license. This applicant is being given an alcohol license while he has not complied with the rules and regulations in fifteen years. As to the fence, he questions the location of the fence. He believes it is on State property.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Council Member Bucci, it was voted to approve the above license application.

Under Discussion:

Chair stated that as to the Entertainment License, he stated to Mr. Miller that he introduced this Ordinance and that if Mr. Miller is ever in violation of that license, this Committee has the right to curtail the hours for entertainment. He asked the applicant to monitor this situation closing and keep the disbursement as quiet as possible and he also asked that the Police Department check on this business at 12:45 A.M. to make sure the business is disbursed properly.

Council President Garabedian asked if Vasa Hall pays any taxes on the property. Attorney Murray stated that they pay approximately \$12,000 per year in Real Estate taxes.

Roll call was taken on motion to approve all the license applications for Miller's Crossing and motion passed unanimously.

Chair indicated that the liquor license application for this applicant be referred to the full City Council for final approval.
