

REGULAR MEETING – CITY COUNCIL

-AUGUST 22, 2005-

Regular meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, August 22, 2005 in the Council Chambers, City Hall, Cranston, Rhode Island.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 P.M. by the Council President.

Roll Call showed the following members present: Councilmen Pisaturo, Fung, Livingston, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilmen Lanni, Barone, Council Vice-President McFarland and Council President Garabedian –9.

Also Present: Paul Grimes, Director of Administration; Robin Muksian-Schutt, Deputy Director of Administration; Michael Glucksman, City Solicitor; Pat Quinlan, City Council Legal Counsel; Jerome Baron, Director of Finance; Mike Igoe, City Controller; Steve Woerner, City Council Internal Auditor.

Minutes of the last meeting were dispensed with and stand approved as recorded.

I. PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND COMMENDATIONS

“CONGRATULATORY CITATION TO MAYOR AND MRS. LAFFEY ON THE BIRTH OF THEIR DAUGHTER, JESSICA ISABEL”

On motion by Councilman Fung, seconded by Council Vice-President McFarland, it was voted to approve this Citation. Motion passed on a vote of 9-0. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Pisaturo, Fung, Livingston, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilmen Lanni, Barone, Council Vice-President McFarland and Council President Garabedian -9.

“CRANSTON WESTERN LITTLE LEAGUE, RI LITTLE LEAGUE STATE CHAMPIONS”

Council President Garabedian and Council Vice-President McFarland presented Citations to the members of the Cranston Western Little League.

II. EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

“REQUEST TO BE PLACED ON PENSION CHIEF ROBERT J. WARREN, CRANSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT”

Mr. Grimes appeared to speak.

On motion by Council Member Fogarty, seconded by Councilman Barone, it was voted to approve this request on a vote of 7-0. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Fung, Livingston, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilman Barone, Council Vice-President McFarland and Council President Garabedian -7. Councilmen Pisaturo and Lanni were not present for roll call vote.

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**“REQUEST TO BE PLACED ON PENSION, CAPTAIN MICHAEL COSTA,
CRANSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT”**

Mr. Grimes appeared to speak.

On motion by Councilman Fung, seconded by Councilman Barone, it was voted to approve this request. Motion passed on a vote of 7-0. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Fung, Livingston, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilman Barone, Council Vice-President McFarland and Council President Garabedian –7. Councilmen Pisaturo and Lanni were not present for roll call vote.

SUBSTANTCE ABUSE/CCAP

Ms. Schutt appeared to speak and stated that during the budget adoption, the Council denied the 20% match for the Substance Abuse Program. She advised the Council that CCAP has approached the City stating that they would like to handle this program. Ms. Schutt stated that CCAP is equipped to handle this program and the Administration strongly supports this. MHRH is willing to accept the City’s donation of space to CCAP as its 20% contribution. She also stated that she will update the Council on any further progress.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT MANAGER

Mr. Grimes advised the Council that Robert Cushman has resigned as Economic Development Manager and he has asked to address the Council to make some comments as an update. Councilman Pisaturo stated that this is not the proper time to discuss this issue since it is not a docketed item. If Mr. Cushman would like to speak as a public speaker, he can speak under Undocketed portion of the meeting, which is at the end of the docket. Councilman Livingston stated that if Mr. Cushman is going to address the Council on what he has done while in this position, that is fine, but if he has comments of personal nature, then he objects to any discussion. Council President Garabedian stated that his position is, Mr. Cushman is welcomed to render a report to the Council on his activities as Economic Development Manager, but if he is going to be making personal comments, then he will be stopped from speaking. Discussion took place on whether this can even be discussed, since this issue was not posted. Council President Garabedian stated that his ruling is if Mr. Cushman has any comments on what progress has been made during his tenure, that will be acceptable. If Mr. Cushman would like to discuss anything in personal nature, then he will be stopped. Council President Garabedian asked if any members of the Council would like to challenge his ruling. No one challenged Council President’s ruling. Mr. Cushman began to read a statement and Councilman Livingston interjected and stated “point of order” on more than one occasion, because Mr. Cushman is not stating any progress made while in the position of Economic Development Manager but rather personal comments.

Councilman Pisaturo motioned to have Mr. Cushman wait until the end of the meeting and allow him to speak under Undocketed portion of the meeting. Councilman Lanni seconded this motion. Motion failed on a vote of 3-6. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Pisaturo, Livingston and Council President Garabedian -3. The following being recorded as voting “nay”: Councilman Fung, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilmen Lanni, Barone and Council Vice-President McFarland -6.

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Mr. Cushman stated that one of the things he did while in this position, was look at hotel development in the City. He did research on fourteen firms that did the bidding at the Westin Hotel in Providence and sent correspondence to these companies and he received two replies back from these companies. He took representatives of these two firms on a tour of the City and they will be coming back in a few weeks. He also stated that there is a leading trucking company looking at locating in the City. He has also looked at a wireless project with the Fire Department. There is also a company called "Terrace Spheres", which are negotiating with real estate people in the City. His department has been looking at re-engineering our permitting process. His department has also been looking at home based businesses. This is something the Council needs to look at for economic development. Council Member Fogarty asked Mr. Cushman if he or the Mayor's Office have submitted Ordinances modifying the home based businesses. Mr. Cushman stated that his department is in the process of doing that. Council Vice-President McFarland stated that years ago, she along with then Councilwoman Ellen O'Hara, tried to pass an Ordinance regarding home based businesses, but it did not get much support at that time. She also stated that she would have liked to have seen the Council members involved as part of the process on any of the items Mr. Cushman indicated his department has looked at. Mr. Cushman stated that when he was hired, he sought out support from this Council and the Council to come see what he was doing and the only people that he saw as Councilmen Barone and Fung.

III. COUNCIL PRESIDENT COMMUNICATIONS

"REVIEW OF JEFFREY KELLY AS HARBOR MASTER"

Jeffrey Kelly, 26 Mystery Farms Rd., appeared to speak and explained his duties as Harbor Master: Harbor Management; Boating Safety and Homeland Security, which he does not feel comfortable discussing in public session. He gave an account of the incident that occurred on July 19, 2005 with Mr. McWade, while on duty as Harbor Master.

Councilman Fung asked Mr. Kelly if he received any training in regards to searches and how he conducts investigations. Mr. Kelly stated that he received Advanced Harbor Master in 1993 from URI and he took refresher courses with the RI Harbor Masters Association. Councilman Fung asked if he, as Harbor Master, has authority to search a vessel. Mr. Kelly stated that as Harbor Master, he can board any vessel and check the vessel, similar to the US Coast Guard. He also stated that under mutual aid law, he has statewide jurisdiction. He also stated that because the City did not have a Harbor Master for a number of years and there were no ticket books, with this particular incident, he took down all the information he could and took that information to Municipal Court to file the charges. He stated that he issued Mr. McWade, the complainant, a verbal warning for speeding two days before he searched his water vehicle.

Councilman Livingston stated that as Councilman for this Ward, he received numerous calls, one being from the RI Yacht Club, complaining that Mr. Kelly is going overboard looking to ticket and cite people, going as far as hiding in the Yacht Club or on a boat. Mr. Kelly stated that everything he has done as Harbor Master, is a result of a complaint. As to him going overboard, yes, he does pose as a boater similar to the police sitting in their cars looking to catch speeders. He also stated that he has been asked by the Yacht Club for him to place more buoys, but he does not have a budget and the buoys cost approximately \$200 each.

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Council President Garabedian suggested that Councilman Livingston host a meeting with the Yacht Club, the boaters in the area and DEM to discuss this matter.

Council Vice-President McFarland stated that the City needs to draft policies and procedures setting forth what the Harbor Master's authority is in an Ordinance form on municipal level. Mr. Kelly stated that his authority is clearly set out in the state law. Council President Garabedian pointed out Chapter 2.32.020 and the areas where the Harbor Master has powers and there are Ordinances on this.

Councilman Lanni asked Mr. Kelly how many warnings he has issued this year. Mr. Kelly stated that he has given out 30-40 warnings since Memorial Day.

Gail Johnson, 91 Armington St., appeared to speak and stated that this is a one man posse. She questioned, since when is a search conducted when the owner of the vehicle is not present and then is cited hours later? This is violating our rights. This is the biggest concern.

Mark McWade appeared to speak and stated that he filed a police report against Mr. Kelly. He also stated that Mr. Kelly was arrogant, disrespectful and condescending. He also stated that when Mr. Kelly pulled him over, he was not breaking any rules.

Mr. Glucksman presented copies of RIGL 46-4 regarding what the powers and duties of the Harbor Master are specifically for Cranston.

IV. COUNCIL MEMBER COMMUNICATIONS

“2005 JAG GRANT/PATROL RESPONSE IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVE”

Council Vice-President McFarland asked Captain Marco Palumbo, Jr. to speak regarding this item. Captain Palumbo stated that these funds total \$47,538 and the use for these funds would be used to purchase patrol vehicles and marked cruisers. He is asking the Council to contribute \$98.10 to purchase these vehicles. Councilman Lanni asked who initiated the paperwork to apply and get this grant. Captain Palumbo stated that the Police Department, under the direction of the Colonel and himself, initiated this. Councilman Lanni commended the Police Department for this initiative.

On motion by Councilman Fung, seconded by Councilman Pisaturo, it was voted to approve this item. Motion passed on a vote of 9-0. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Pisaturo, Fung, Livingston, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilmen Lanni, Barone, Council Vice-President McFarland and Council President Garabedian -9.

Councilman Livingston stated that he received communication from some residents on Harbor Terrace and he stated that there are six homes that are not connected to sewer and they want to place a sewer main in the City. He was told by the City that the residents would have to pay for this and the City would be responsible for the sewer main. He asked that a copy of this letter be forwarded to the Public Works Director and be placed on the next Public Works Committee meeting agenda. He also asked that, if possible, a report be provided for the next Public Works Committee meeting on the City's policies and procedures on whether the City can pay for this or has the City done this in the past, because he believes this was done for Sea View Avenue in the past.

Councilman Livingston stated that he received a number of calls from residents in his Ward regarding students attending our schools who are not residents of Cranston. He asked that the Superintendent of Schools provide a follow-up report on that issue, stating how many people have been determined to have been attending our schools illegally and how many have been expelled and what are we doing going forward to prevent this from happening again.

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Councilman Fung asked that Resolution abandoning a portion of Terrace Ave., under Public Works Committee, be taken out of order since the petitioner has an independent surveyor present. No one objected.

COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC WORK (John E. Lanni, Jr., Chair)

“RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ABANDONMENT OF A PORTION OF TERRACE AVENUE”

Andrew Henneous, Esq. appeared to represent the petitioner. He stated that at the Public Works Committee meeting, he discussed this abandonment with Mr. Williamson, abutting property owner, and he was not opposed to this abandonment. At that time, both parties agreed to split the costs and split the property in question. Attorney Henneous stated that since that meeting, he has not heard from Mr. Williamson and does not see him present this evening and he does not see any problems with him objecting to this.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Council Vice-President McFarland, it was voted to table this Resolution. Motion passed on a vote of 9-0. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Pisaturo, Fung, Livingston, Council Member Fogarty, Council Member Bucci, Councilmen Lanni, Barone, Council Vice-President McFarland and Council President Garabedian -9.

V. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Anthony Lupino, 21 Black Oak Court, School Committee member, appeared to speak regarding Ordinance 6-05-4 and thanked the Council for the time and effort they put in this Ordinance. He also spoke regarding Ordinance 6-05-5 regarding the position of Architectural Technician and stated that this position is a very very vital function. Council Vice-President McFarland stated that this Ordinance was advertised and drafted as a “Classified” position and it should be “Unclassified” and this would need to be amended and re-advertised. Mr. Lupino spoke regarding the issue of students attending Cranston schools who are not residents of Cranston. He stated that the School Department has implemented a new database to track the residency of students to establish that they actually live in Cranston, and they have also established central registration. This has been quite successful and was never done before. They are also requiring the filing of an affidavit affirming their residency in Cranston. Mr. Lupino also spoke regarding the issue of the Harbor Master and stated that he thinks Mr. Kelly is doing his job and people are going to complain if they get cited.
