John Lombardi, Esq., appeared to represent the applicant. Chair asked if fire code violations have been addressed. Chief Delgado stated, not at this point.

Chair addressed the outstanding invoices for the Police and Fire detail and asked what the amount is that the City is owed from the applicant. Chief Delgado stated that for Fire, as of July 31, 2007, they owe \$12,597.84. **Colonel McGrath** stated that for Police, as of July 31, 2007, they owe \$1,933.45. Chair asked that Attorney Lombardi addresses these issues. **Joseph Miele**, of Jimmy D's, appeared to speak and stated that as to the Fire issue, they have finished fire inspection on alarm system and now they can start moving forward on installing sheet rock on the fire code. Attorney Lombardi presented a copy of a loan application and stated that as soon as the loan is approved, the invoices will all be paid.

Chair addressed the possible reconsideration of sale of alcohol to underage persons. Attorney Lombardi addressed Rule 14 of the Council Rules and also Roberts Rules to reconsider. Chair asked Solicitor's opinion in regards to the tie vote at last month's meeting. Solicitor Garganese stated that it depends on how you interpret the prevailing side. Council President Garabedian stated that the question is, when is the prevailing side in a 3-3 tie vote.

On motion by Councilman Barone, seconded by Councilman Navarro, it was voted to recess the meeting for five minutes.

The meeting reconvened.

Colonel McGrath appeared to speak regarding the incident that took place when the minor was served alcohol. He stated that this sting operation was conducted as part of the Statewide program.

Chair indicated that this Committee has imposed \$250 fine and one day suspension on other businesses and given the business the choice of which day they would be closed.

Attorney Lombardi stated that this issue is improperly before this Committee. The vote taken at last month's meeting failed on a tie vote. There was an appeal period and the meeting adjourned. The City should have appealed to the State Board. He referred to a case of "Community Home Builders vs. Town of North Kingstown". He questioned where the Police Officer who cited this business is and where is the alcohol that was sold to the minor.

Councilman Santamaria stated that this Committee is an Administrative Committee and not a courtroom. He indicated to Attorney Lombardi that it seems like he is questioning the program.

Councilman Livingston asked Solicitor if he is familiar with the case Attorney Lombardi referred to. Solicitor Garganese stated, no, he has not seen this case.

Councilman Livingston motioned to have the Solicitor review this case and determine if we this Committee can properly hear this case. If Solicitor feels that this Committee can have a full hearing, then this Committee will decide the penalty, if any. Council Member Bucci seconded the motion.

Under Discussion:

Council President Garabedian asked that Solicitor examine this State program if whether it meets the basic process rights and whether this program meets the standards of due process. Chair stated that this program is used throughout the State of Rhode Island and is run by the State.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Councilman Navarro, it was voted to continue this item for one month. Motion passed unanimously.

Chair asked that the Solicitor address the Zoning issue. Solicitor Sciolto stated that he spoke to the Zoning Department and asked for an update on this issue. Attorney Lombardi stated that he does not see this issue being listed on the letter he received from the City Clerk of this being an item to be discussed this evening and he cautioned the Committee that they may not be in compliance of Open Meeting. Chair stated that this issue will be continued to next month's meeting.

On motion by Councilman Santamaria, seconded by Council Member Bucci, it was voted to recommend approval of this Ordinance to the full Council and re-advertised. Motion passed unanimously.

Richard James of Apex Construction, appeared to speak and stated that nothing has changed except there have been some dimensional problems in bring the buildings together. All the steel has been delivered, but since there is no room for storage on site, it is stored in a nearby facility.

Councilman Barone asked how many times the schedule has been amended. Attorney DiBona stated that there have been delays, but there has been only one schedule provided.

Councilman Livingston asked that, going forward, the contractor notify the Chair of this Committee or the City Clerk if there are any changes to the schedule at any time. Attorney DiBona stated that this information is being provided to the Mayor's Office and the Economic Development Department, but he will also provide it to the Clerk's Office. Attorney DiBona presented copies of pictures showing the steel that is stored at a nearby facility, since there is no room to store it all on site.

Councilman Navarro stated that looking at the schedule, from September through October, there is a lot going on, he asked how will all these tasks be completed. Mr. James stated that the majority of the work is on exterior of the building. It is just a matter of organizing. Councilman Navarro stated that based on the December 11, 2007 completion date, if this project is not completed, this Committee will pull the liquor license. He asked if he can be assured that this project will be done by then, because this Committee cannot keep these extensions going on and on and having applicant attending this meeting month after month. He is going to stay on top of this and make sure it gets done.

On motion by Council Member Bucci, seconded by Councilman Livingston, it was voted to continue this item to the January, 2008 meeting.

Chair stated that this is the longest running project in the City of Cranston. The Council wants it completed by January, 2008. He asked the developer to please comply.

Council President Garabedian asked Councilman Livingston, as Ward Councilman for area of Rhodes, if he recalls any events held at Rhodes recently which have created a problem. Councilman Livingston stated that he has received no complaints since he has been on the Council.

Colonel McGrath stated that problems occurred when there were boxing matches and concerts and these types of events no longer take place at Rhodes.

Chief Delgado stated that the Fire Department has not had any issues with this establishment

Council President Garabedian questioned if there is any need for continuing this procedure of having a list of events provided to the City by this establishment since there is a lot of paperwork involved and there have not been any problems. Councilman Livingston stated that it is a good idea to have this list provided so the Council will be kept updated on what events are being held there.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Councilman Santamaria, it was voted to approve these lists of events. Motion passed unanimously.
