II. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:

Attorney Murray stated that his client has provided postal services and Western Union services to the community, along with the Liquor sale. His client has hired an architect in order to subdivide the space and plans will be submitted to this effect to address the liquor services and the postal and Western Union services.

Michael Gianfrancesco, 162 Hines Farm Rd., appeared to speak. Chief Delgado stated that the inspection on this building was done on January 9, 2008. The building has three deficiencies – local fire alarm system, emergency lighting and exit signs in the basement and enclosed electrical wires. He does not have any objections to the Committee approving this license as long as applicant provides plan of action to correct these deficiencies within 30 days. Mr. Gianfrancesco stated that within the two to three months, he can get the designs needed. The biggest item he has to do is the design for the alarm system.

Assistant Solicitor Garganese provided his opinion. He stated that this is already addressed under State Law. Chair asked if the State Law would make this Ordinance mute. Assistant Solicitor Garganese stated that it would just duplicate it.

Councilman Barone stated that what he does not see in this Ordinance is a code enforcement to check on the establishments and he does not see any remedy on anyone who is in violation.

Major Blackmar stated that one of the problems is that the Police Department does not know who has the permits. Chair stated that the Police Department can obtain copies of those records from the Clerk’s Office, since they are on file in her office.

On motion by Councilman Santamaria, seconded by Councilman Barone, it was voted to grandfather all existing plans of existing establishments, which are on file.

VIII. POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Brian Cinq-Mars - Applicant requested to appear

Gregory Acciardo, Esq., appeared to represent applicant.

Major Blackmar stated that there are several questions that the Police Department has with this applicant. The biggest concern is who is involved in this business. Attorney Acciardo stated that this property has been used as this type of business for over 20 years, formerly known as Cyber Auto Sales. The principal, John DeSantis, passed away last year. Under State Law, that license is null and void. Application was then made by Greg Aloisio to take over Cyber Auto. The property then was leased to other persons. Mr. Aloisio now is the rightful owner of the property and title issues have been resolved. As to the issue of who is involved with the dealership, this is the first step in the application stage. When going for a State License, there are a number of criteria that have to be met. The only issue before the Board is this applicant qualified to have this business and the premises qualified for this type of business. The answer to both questions is yes.

Major Blackmar stated that there have been several investigations on this establishment in the past, involved with persons that may be involved with this business. This is why there is a concern of who the principals are of this business.

City Clerk stated that this location and Mr. Aloisio has a long history with the City of Cranston. As to this particular application, an application was filed for Alyssa Auto Group, Inc. in 2007 and Mr. Aloisio was the sole applicant, which was subsequently withdrawn and now we have a different business name with a different principal.

Attorney Acciardo stated that we have an applicant with no safety violations and no criminal record.

VIII. POLICE DEPARTMENT: (Cont.)

Brian Cinq-Mars - Applicant requested to appear

Major Blackmar stated that the only question the Police Department has is if Mr. Aloisio is in any way involved with this business. Attorney Acciardo stated that he is the owner of the property, leasing the property.

City Clerk stated that application has not gone through the advertising and notification process, it has not done that. This item was placed on the agenda at the request of the Colonel because the applicant was uncooperative in getting answers to questions.

Attorney Acciardo requested that he subpoena records from the Police Department pertaining to Mr. Aloisio's involvement of any infractions. Major Blackmar stated that the Police Department will make all that information available.

City Clerk stated that as for "Car Depot", Mr. Aloisio was operating without a license and there were extensive hearings held with the presence of the State Dealer's Commission and the City did not grant Mr. Aloisio a license based on evidence presented at the time. Attorney Acciardo has been involved in hearings relating to 11 East Josephine St.

Chair stated that this will be continued with advertising process and have hearing on this and Mr. Cinq-Mars is to provide an affidavit that he has no interest in the business.

Vasa Music Hall Association and Miller's Crossing

Robert Murray, Esq., appeared to represent Vasa Hall and Miller's Crossing and stated that they are present in response to correspondence sent by the Clerk's Office. Attorney Murray addressed the issue of the relationship between Vasa Hall and Miller's Crossing. He stated that approximately one year ago, Miller's Crossing applied for outdoor searing. That application was withdrawn. At that time, he provided Assistant Solicitor Garganese with documents. Miller's Crossing rents lower level from Vasa Hall. He suggested to Miller's Crossing that perhaps they should apply for a Class B and Vasa Hall could operate with their Class D. The details for this have not been worked out yet. There have been a few incidents at this location, which he assumes have to do with noise. They are working on installing some fencing, which would serve as a visual and noise buffer. They are trying to do what they can to be a good neighbor and work with the neighbors and the Police.

Major Blackmar stated that the Police Department does have some minor concerns. After speaking with Attorney Murray and Mr. Miller of Miller's Crossing, they have agreed to have a trial period on Fridays and Saturdays of Police detail outside got gout hours for the next few months and Miller's Crossing will pay for the detail. Major Blackmar stated that he will report back to the Committee next month for status report.

Vasa Music Hall Association and Miller's Crossing

Arthur Holmberg and David Miller - licensee requested to appear

Myrna Moore, 55 Bald Hill Rd., appeared to speak and stated that she is also representing her son, whom she lives with and could not attend this evening. She stated that the noise is not only at closing time, it starts at 10:00 p.m. There is a patio bar, which people use to smoke and drink and make a lot of noise and race in the street. Mr. Miller has not cooperated with the residents that have asked him numerous times to put someone to escort the patrons to their cars and he has not done that.

Mike Langlois, owner of 55 Bald Hill Rd., appeared to speak and stated that all that is being asked is the business be managed properly. This is a non-profit organization and by Miller's Crossing to be operating there, is a violation of the Code. He is not so sure a fence will solve the problems. He would like this resolved because this is not something to be taken lightly. As far as the Police detail, it should be done randomly and not just weekends. What the Police Department has found is most of the incidents are on weekends. He can increase the patrol for the area. Mr. Langlois stated that he has made his insurance company and his attorney aware of the problems just in case something happens on his property.

Councilman Santamaria asked Mr. Miller if he does in fact have an outdoor patio.

David Miller, of Miller's Crossing, appeared to speak and stated that he filed and provided plans for a small smoking area and consumption of liquor for Vasa Hall and it was approved by this Committee.

Chair asked how long Vasa Hall has been at this location. **Lloyd Smith**, Treasurer of Vasa Hall, appeared to speak and stated that Vasa Hall started on Wellington Ave. In 1962, the present location was purchased. He stated that Vasa Hall cannot afford to stay at this location if they cannot have the type of help, such as Miller's Crossing. Vasa Hall is non-profit, but they do pay taxes, property taxes, income taxes and fees for any licenses they need.

Councilman Navarro asked Mr. Smith if he was aware of these problems. Mr. Smith stated that he has been aware of the allegations. When he is at the Hall, there is noise, but that is the nature of the beast when you have liquor establishment. He stated that Mr. Miller does an excellent job running Miller's Crossing.

Councilman Barone questioned Mr. Langlois why he made his insurance company and attorney aware of these problems. He asked why the City would be liable if something happens on his property. Mr. Langlois stated that he made them aware of this to find out what his liability is and to what extension.

On motion by Councilman Santamaria, seconded by Councilman Barone, it was voted to continue this item for one month. Motion passed unanimously.

Chair stated that in all the years, to his knowledge, there has never been any problems at Vasa Hall and hopefully, within the next 30 days, these problems will be corrected.
