

REGULAR MEETING – CITY COUNCIL

-JANUARY 26, 2009-

Regular meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, January 26, 2009 in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 869 Park Ave., Cranston, Rhode Island.

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 P.M. by the Council President.

Roll Call showed the following members present: Councilmen Lupino, Aceto, Navarro, Archetto, Pelletier, Santamaria, Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews, Council Vice-President Livingston and Council President Lanni -9.

Also Present: Robin Muksian-Schutt, Director of Administration; Gerald Cordy, Deputy Director of Administration; Evan Kirshenbaum, Assistant City Solicitor; Mike Igoe, City Controller; Patrick Quinlan, City Council Legal Counsel; Steve Woerner, City Council Internal Auditor; Peter LaPolla, City Planner.

Minutes of the last meeting were dispensed with and stand approved as recorded.

I. PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND COMMENDATIONS

II. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Richard Rodolf, 30 Robert Circle, appeared to oppose to Ordinance 7-08-2 and stated that this Ordinance is meant to circumvent the current Planning and Zoning process in the City.

Cynthia Fogarty appeared to speak as a board member of the Cranston Chamber of Commerce regarding Ordinance 7-08-2 and stated that the Chamber requests that the Council take into consideration all the benefits that the members bring to the City of Cranston.

Richard Brown, 171 Hilltop Dr., member of the Conservation Commission, appeared to oppose to Ordinance 7-08-2.

Raymond Tomasso, Esq., appeared to speak as a resident of 150 Lyndon Rd. and is opposed to Ordinance 7-08-2. He stated that the residents are not opposed to development, they would like responsible development, such as an office development.

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Dan Beardsley, 130 Lyndon Rd., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 7-08-2 and presented pictures of the Super Stop and Shop on Garfield Ave. showing trash and debris from the supermarket.

Representative Arthur Handy, 26 Welfare Ave., appeared to speak and stated that the City needs economic development, but he cautioned the Council against this type of precedent setting. He urged that the current process be followed, such as a variance.

Rita Houlihan appeared to speak on behalf of the Pawtuxet River Authority and stated that the Authority is opposed to Ordinance 7-08-2 and the Authority asks that the Council do not shortcut the due diligence process.

Ramsey Davis, 48 Fordson Ave., appeared to speak as a member of the Cranston Citizens for Responsible Zoning and Development and stated that the board met last week and voted unanimously opposed to Ordinance 7-08-2.

Greg DiStefano, 65 Waite Ave., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 7-08-2.

Rachel McNally, 113 Hilltop Dr., appeared to speak and stated that if Ordinance 7-08-2 is approved, it would set a precedent. There is a process that should be followed.

Steve Stycos, 37 Ferncrest Ave., appeared to speak on behalf of the Friends of the Pawtuxet and urged the Council not to approve Ordinance 7-08-2 and the variance process should be followed, which would allow public input.

William York, 139 Shelton St., appeared to oppose to Ordinance 7-08-2 and stated that by approving this Ordinance, the Council would be prohibiting due diligence.

IV. REPORT OF COMMITTEES

ORDINANCE COMMITTEE (Anthony J. Lupino, Chair)

**7-08-2 “ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF TITLE 17 OF THE CODE
OF THE CITY OF CRANSTON, 2005, ENTITLED ‘ZONING’
(Definitions)”**

On motion by Councilman Lupino, seconded by Councilman Aceto, it was voted to approve the above Ordinance.

Under Discussion:

Council Vice-President Livingston stated that he has received an enormous amount of telephone calls and e-mails from constituents who are opposed to this Ordinance. The neighbors who live in this area do not want this project and so he will vote to oppose this Ordinance. He indicated that Suzanne Arena, who is a member of the Cranston Citizens for Responsible Zoning and Development and a constituent of his, could not stay to speak, but asked that he for the record on her behalf that this organization is also opposed to this Ordinance.

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Councilman Navarro stated that he will also vote to oppose this Ordinance. This would set a major precedent going forward. One of the issues is the Pawtuxet River which is one of the jewels in that area. By bypassing the zoning variance process, it takes away the right of the citizens, City Council and the City to speak. Another issue is there is no recommendation from the Planning Commission.

Councilman Aceto asked how many other parcels in this City would be affected if this Ordinance was approved. Mr. LaPolla stated that GIS has prepared a map of parcels Zoned C-5 and there are approximately 6-8 parcels. If this Ordinance is approved, it would move the use table by definition. Use by right, it does not preclude the public permitting process under any circumstances. This would be subject to Site Plan Review. Councilman Aceto asked if any restrictions could be implemented if this Ordinance was adopted. Mr. LaPolla stated that under our current Zoning Ordinance, any business or development of 5,000 sq. ft. or more would be subject to Site Plan Review.

Ms. Schutt stated that the Administration would be willing to hold a neighborhood meeting prior to Site Plan Review to address the concerns of the neighbors.

Councilman Archetto stated that what concerns him is that there is no representative from Stop and Shop to advocate their position for the project. Ms. Schutt indicated that there is no plan at this point.

On motion by Councilman Lupino, seconded by Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews, it was voted to amend this Ordinance as follows: Change 2,500 square feet to 10,000 and add the following sentence after any food product "Any food retailers that exceeds 10,000 sq. ft. shall be classified as a retail food establishment." And delete the definition in Section 2. Motion passed on a vote of 7-2. The following being recorded as voting "aye": Councilmen Lupino, Aceto, Archetto, Pelletier, Santamaria, Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews and Council President Lanni -7. The following being recorded as voting "nay": Councilman Navarro and Council Vice-President Livingston -2.

Ms. Schutt reported on the following:

- Dyer Ave. bridge had weight restrictions placed on it. There is a slight concern that one particular area will have increased response time by Police and Fire impacted and we are imploring RI DOT to make any necessary improvements, even if they are temporary, in order to open up that bridge. We are also speaking with RIPTA. The City is also working with the Traffic Engineer, who is placing alternate route for this bridge. We also have weight restrictions on Pontiac Ave. and Reservoir Ave. and we are looking at having alternate routes.
- There has been a concern brought up regarding Veolia Water and a camera for drains and that the camera was not compliant with the type of equipment the City had. The status of the camera is that there is an agreement drafted between Veolia and the City and Board of Contract and Purchase was aware of this agreement. The concern she has is there was an Ordinance passed several years ago regarding donation of a fire truck and any donation is to be done by the City Council. She will follow up and meet with the Solicitor to see if this Council needs to approve this agreement. The agreement reads that Veolia Water would get the camera and in trade with the camera, Veolia would provide the retrofit of the camera on our truck and provide the training and give the City \$12,500. She will keep the Council apprised of any new developments or any new information.

Council Vice-President Livingston stated that perhaps this issue could come up during the budget process.

Councilman Aceto asked Ms. Schutt if it is too premature for the Administration to provide for the February Finance Committee meeting a plan showing 5%, 10% or 20% cut by each department. Ms. Schutt stated that it might be tight for that meeting. It might be difficult to predict anything until we know what is going to happen with the Governor's budget. She stated that she could try to provide an analysis for the next meeting.

Councilman Pelletier stated that he would like an update on the School Department on what is going on with their budget deficit. Council President Lanni asked Mr. Woerner for any input. Mr. Woerner stated that he does not have an exact analysis at this time. He would estimate the number to be at approximately \$3.3 million, not factoring in the State Aid.
