II. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING :

On motion by Councilman Barone, seconded by Councilman Santamaria, it was voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and they stand approved as recorded. Motion passed unanimously.

Solicitor stated that application has been withdrawn.

On motion by Councilman Barone, seconded by Council Member Bucci, it was voted to remove this item from the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

Vincent Martucci, Jr., 39 Highland St., appeared to speak. Chief Delgado stated that all the fire codes have been upgraded. The only thing the Fire Department is waiting for is a diagram of the tent and permit process. Mr. Martucci stated that the tent is 7-10 weeks away. The new tent has not arrived yet. The current tent, he does not have proof of fire retardant. Councilman Barone asked what events are held under the tent at the current time. Mr. Martucci stated that the current tent is used for dinners after golf tournaments. Councilman Barone asked Chief Delgado if applicant can still use the current tent at this time. Chief Delgado stated that if the applicant takes precautions and he has fire extinguishers, the Fire Department will allow him to continue to use the current tent. Chair stated that applicant needs to provide some documentation to the Fire Chief indicating that the new tent has been ordered and is flame retardant.

On motion by Councilman Barone, seconded by Councilman Santamaria, it was voted to continue this item for two months. Motion passed unanimously.

Steven Abbate appeared to speak and stated that he has received a building permit and building is under construction. Councilman Barone asked what the target date is for the Certificate of Occupancy. Mr. Abbate stated three to four months, at the most.

On motion by Council President Garabedian, seconded by Councilman Santamaria, it was voted to continue this item for six months and if construction is done before that date, the Committee can hear this item earlier, in order for the liquor license to be approved. Motion passed unanimously.

Chair stated that Park Cinema was to be listed on the agenda for a status update and it was inadvertently omitted. He asked that the Committee hear the status update since the applicant and the attorney for Park Cinema are present.

John DiBona, Esq., appeared to represent the applicant and stated that a site visit was held last week with the Mayor, Economic Development Director, Councilman Navarro and the developer. There has been some delay for that site visit because there was no steel erection going on due to a part missing off the steel crane and OSHA shut the construction down until the crane was repaired. Within the next four weeks or so, the steel erection will be completed. There is work going on and applicant is trying to keep to the schedule provided to the Committee, but there have been some delays with the steel erection.

Councilman Navarro stated that we need to really keep tabs on what is going on at this site and on a month to month basis this should be reviewed because this project is moving in a snail pace. He would like to see a timetable. He recommended that we keep tabs on the project on a month to month basis and we need to see some significant progress.

Chair stated that the Committee needs an updated timetable so we know exactly where we stand. This project impacts all of Rolfe St. The Committee expects some significant progress in the next few months.

Attorney DiBona stated that in going forward, he will provide an updated timetable to the Economic Development Director and the Council with any explanation of any delays.

Councilman Lupino questioned why a crane wasn't rented. He also indicated that there has been no electrical work done as has been stated. As to the City Hall parking lot being used by the patrons, he asked in the past where the employees of the Cinema would park and the Committee was told there would be onsite parking for the employees. When he visited the site, he did not see parking for the employees. He would like to see a parking plan.

Paul Plourde of Park Cinema, appeared to speak and stated there has never been any onsite parking. Attorney DiBona stated that there is on-street parking, there is significant parking on Park Ave., which they can use.

Councilman Lupino stated that this project will not be done by October. He seriously suggests to the Committee to review this on a month to month basis.

On motion by Councilman Navarro, seconded by Councilman Barone, it was voted to continue this item to next month's meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

SHOW CAUSE HEARING:

John Lombardi, Esq., appeared to represent the applicant. Chair asked for update on fire code violations. Chief Delgado stated that the applicant is still working on fire alarm system and still have to install the wall from the front and rear part of the building.

Alfred Cairone, co-owner, appeared to speak and stated that this week they came up with a plan and they are closing the business to install all the soundproofing and address the fire code violations.

Chair asked that the liquor violation be addressed next. Attorney Lombardi presented a handout and he indicated that a letter of notice of meeting was sent to him by the City Clerk dated June 5, 2007 and it was received on the 7th. As to the liquor violation, the Colonel provided him with two documents and the City Clerk provided him with three. He would like the opportunity to cross-examine the individual who was served the liquor in order for him to know what his client is being accused of. Chair stated that this was part of a sting operation and he would not allow a minor to be cross-examined.

Council President Garabedian asked if there is standard operation procedure by Ordinance where there is proper notice that we meet the standards of due process. Commander Lynch stated that there are standard procedures set by the State guidelines, since this sting operation is governed by the State. There are protocols established where the minors are being safeguarded by not mentioning the names in the Police Reports.

Chair stated that the City Clerk has advised him that if Attorney Lombardi had requested the detectives to appear this evening, she would have notified the Police Department for them to appear. Attorney Lombardi chose not to go that road.

Councilman Barone asked Commander Lynch how establishments are notified of the violation. Commander Lynch stated that in this particular case, they were notified in person a few days later, on April 5, 2007, in order to protect the identity of the minor.

Councilman Santamaria asked Mr. Cairone if the bartenders are all TIPS certified. Mr. Cairone stated, yes.

Attorney Lombardi stated that two Police Officers went into the establishment a few days later and told his client that nothing would come of this. Commander Lynch stated that he is not aware of this. Councilman Santamaria asked Attorney Lombardi if he is questioning the legality of the program the Police Department is following or the Committee's due process. Attorney Lombardi stated that he is questioning the due process and he does not believe the Police Department complied with the program. Chair asked for Solicitor's opinion. Solicitor stated that this is not a criminal proceeding. The opportunity to cross examination is not needed, and is not required. The committee can rely on the Police Report. Council President Garabedian stated that there should be an Ordinance setting procedure for this type of issue. Chair stated that this is an administrative process not a criminal matter. If the establishment being cited disagrees, they can take it to Court.

Councilman Santamaria stated that he was provided with information from Chief Delgado regarding outstanding invoices for Fire detail going back to February. Chair stated that copies of these invoices will be provided to Attorney Lombardi.

Chair quoted Section 17-64-0.10(b) "off street parking" and stated that due to this section, applicant may be in violation of our Zoning laws. This will be forwarded to the Zoning Board of Review for a decision regarding legality of it and whether a variance is needed or not.

Council President Garabedian stated that the business owner has to hire an attorney, they are small business and this is their first offense and this is why we let them pick the day. We try to show some leniency. Chair stated that this is the first year we are imposing the one day suspension because the amount of violations have increased significantly and in order to send a message out that this Council does not take serving to minors lightly. This Committee takes this very very seriously.
