Attorney Peter Furness, Receiver for corporation, appeared to speak. Chair asked Solicitor if there are any concerns regarding this. Solicitor Garganese stated, not based on what he has heard so far.

Attorney Joseph Keough appeared to represent the transferee.

Robert Jacquard, Esq., appeared to represent God Bless Corporation, d/b/a Capital Liquors and Vipra Inc., d/b/a Morin's Liquors, and stated that both of these corporations are opposed to this transfer. Both corporations are family run businesses and their families depend on their income and granting this transfer will greatly threaten them if this business is allowed to operate at this location. Both of these corporations have made substantial investments in their businesses.

Councilman Barone asked if the owner of People's Liquor is the same person as the transferee. Attorney Furness stated, yes, but a different corporation. Councilman Barone asked if People's Liquor owes any taxes to the City. Attorney Furness stated, not that he is aware of. City Clerk stated that People's Liquor is in arrears in the amount of approximately \$1,400. Attorney Keough stated that the statements made by Attorney Jacquard is about competition. There is nothing in the State Law that allows a Committee to set up a no-competitive zone.

Councilman Santamaria asked who owned People's Liquor before going into Receivership. Attorney Keough stated, Emily Haronian. An auction was held and this corporation submitted the highest bid.

Councilman Navarro stated that he will vote against this transfer. This is a City license and it should be returned to the City, since we have a few liquor license applications that are on the agenda that are over the cap.

Councilman Barone stated that his concern is not that the City is owed taxes. His concern is, are we going to be here again in a year addressing another Receivership being filed and the City is owed taxes.
