John Lombardi, Esq., appeared to represent the applicant. Chair stated that last week, a meeting was held to discuss the violation, sound, parking and fire code violation. He asked if any progress has been made on any of those items. **Alfred Carione**, co-owner, appeared to speak and stated that they have submitted several different products for the soundproofing, the day after the meeting and they have been submitted to the Fire Department. Once they are approved by the Fire Department, the material will be ordered.

Chief Delgado stated that the soundproofing material was received in his office and sample was sent to the State Fire Marshall's Office and they are waiting for their approval. Chair asked how long it will take for the State to look at this material. Chief Delgado also stated that he can call the State tomorrow to find out approximately the timeframe.

Chair asked if a permit has been taken out to take out the wall. Mr. Carione stated, yes, that work will be started tomorrow.

Chair asked Attorney Lombardi if he has received any documents from the Clerk's Office. Attorney Lombardi stated that he did not receive anything from the last meeting of this Committee or from the day of the meeting last week. He also did not receive any notice of the liquor violation. He stated that a subpoena was serve on the 25th for the Police Report regarding the violation of serving to minor, but has not received that report. He also has not received the two informal complaints as per the Ordinance in place – Sect. 8.20.010(g)(5) and the underage person complaints. Chair stated that the City Clerk was asked to provide this information to Attorney Lombardi at the last meeting. Council President Garabedian stated that there needs to be a policy in place that once an attorney records himself as the attorney, he receives any documents or information dealing with the client.

Councilman Santamaria asked for an update on the noise readings from last month. Colonel McGrath stated that as to the statement made by Attorney Lombardi regarding the informal noise complaints, the Police Department is not making any formal complaints or violations. We are looking to correct the problem with the business.

Council President Garabedian confirmed that there was a meeting held last week and it was fully attended by everyone, business owner, City personnel and residents.

On motion by Councilman Barone, seconded by Councilman Livingston, it was voted to continue this item for one month. Motion passed unanimously.

Lawrence Altman, Esq., 862 Reservoir Ave., appeared to represent the applicant.

Solicitor addressed the letter from Attorney Sydney Paull on behalf of Edna Tipple, potential creditor. Attorney Altman stated that this letter is a separate issue from the violation issue. Ms. Tipple is trying to use this Committee as a collection agency. Solicitor stated that in order to investigate the allegation made by Attorney Paull, we cannot do that because we do not have the resources. Council President Garabedian asked applicants if they still own the business. David Stryzek and Emilia Strzala appeared to speak and stated that they hired a manager to run the business. They still own the business.

Roland Tipple appeared to speak and stated that he sold the restaurant to the Mr. Stryzek and Ms. Strzala and he holds a mortgage of over \$100,000 on the condition that they could not lease, sub-lease or rent the restaurant out, as the State Law states. Chair stated to Mr. Tipple that he has presented no evidence to this Committee whatsoever indicating that they do not own this business any longer, other than accusations. The liquor license is in their name. He also indicated to Mr. Tipple that his situation is a civil matter. Solicitor stated that his opinion is that he reviewed the letter from Attorney Paull and he does not believe there has been evidence presented of breach of liquor law, but if the Committee feels a hearing should be held, it is up to the Committee. Council President Garabedian stated that he does not feel any evidence was presented for this Committee to address this issue. The applicants have a right to hire people to work for them.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Councilman Navarro, it was voted to move on to the liquor violation on this establishment. Motion passed unanimously.

Attorney Altman asked for a continuance on this matter since he does not have a copy of the Police Report. He asked if he could be provided with a copy of the report. He also stated that he does not know which bartender was that served the minor and if the employee is certified.

On motion by Council President Garabedian, seconded by Councilman Livingston, it was voted to continue this matter to next month's meeting. Councilman Santamaria opposed.

Major Blackmar provided a copy of the Police Report to Attorney Altman.

Councilman Lupino stressed that the bartenders and any servers must be TIPS certified by State Law.

Council President Garabedian asked what the hours of operation would be for outside seating. Mr. Stryzek stated 1:00 PM to 8:00 PM, but not every day.

On motion by Councilman Livingston, seconded by Councilman Barone, it was voted to continue this request with concerns or questions stated by the Chair. Motion passed unanimously.

Joseph Lachut, Esq., appeared to represent the establishment. He stated that his client is not contesting the violation. They admit to it. He has had no prior violation and is suggesting a six month probation rather than a fine. Attorney Lachut also stated that the bartender who served the minor has gone through the certification process.

Major Blackmar addressed the violation and stated that on April 5, 2007, the Police was working with the State Program and sent in two individuals, who were underage, into the restaurant and both minors were served.

On motion by Councilman Santamaria, seconded by Councilman Navarro, it was voted to fine applicant \$250.00 and one day suspension, out of fairness to an applicant last month who had no prior history. Motion passed unanimously.

On motion by Council President Garabedian, seconded by Councilman Livingston, it was voted to move the question. Councilman Barone opposed.

Chair stated that as to the one day suspension, that will be left up to the applicant which day he chooses to close and for him to notify the Clerk's Office which day he will be closed. Hopefully, it will be within the next two weeks and the fine to be paid prior to re-opening. Chair also asked that the City Clerk notify the Police Department which day the applicant will be closed.

IV. OLD BUSINESS: (Cont.)

1-07-2 Ordinance in amendment of Title 5.64 of the Code of the Code of the City of Cranston, 2005, entitled "Business Licenses and Regulations" (Public Entertainment License). Continued from 5/14/2007.

Patrick Harrington, owner of Fitzpatrick's Club, appeared to speak and stated that the way this Ordinance is worded, businesses would not be able to have any type of entertainment. He would not be able to stay in business the way this Ordinance is drafted. His business abuts residents and they do not have any problems with him having entertainment. This Ordinance will hurt a lot of local taverns and restaurants in the City who have entertainment.

Chair stated that what the Council is trying to do with this Ordinance is it will take care of not just the businesses, but the residents that abut those businesses. A business with 100 people capacity would not fall in this Ordinance.

Mr. Harrington stated that the closing time in this Ordinance is also an issue because at closing time, there will be a mass exodus going into other cities, such as Providence. Council President Garabedian stated to Mr. Harrington that by him coming to this meeting, it will be weighed in what the final Ordinance will be. No one on the Council wants to put anyone out of business or hurt a business.

John Reedy, owner of Mardi Gras Nightclub, appeared to speak and stated that changed hours, condensed entertainment parameters will make it totally hard for existing businesses to operate. He asked for the Council to think very careful of who this Ordinance would effect and how. The Committee should have a work session with business owners to get their input and ideas regarding this Ordinance.

Bob Cerrasito, 400 Meshanticut Park Place, owner of Cerrasito Entertainment, appeared to address his concerns regarding this Ordinance.

Anthony Gudas, owner of Shara's, former West End Café, appeared to speak. He stated that he purchased the business one year ago and in February of 2007, he closed the restaurant and spent \$140,000 to renovate the business and to bring it up to code. He was leasing two units near his business, but now has purchased them. If this Ordinance is passed as drafted, it will hurt his business drastically. The 12:00 AM closing will drastically hurt his business along with other businesses in the City because people will leave his business and go to Providence. Chair asked Mr. Gudas what the capacity is of his business. Mr. Gudas stated, 140 people. Chair asked Mr. Gudas if he has enough parking spaces. Mr. Gudas stated that he met with the Building Official and has not heard back from him.

IV. OLD BUSINESS: (Cont.)

1-07-3 Ordinance in amendment of Title 5.64 of the Code of the Code of the City of Cranston, 2005, entitled "Business Licenses and Regulations" (Public Entertainment License). Continued from 5/14/2007.

David Bouchard, owner of Avalon Restaurant & Martini Bar, appeared to speak and stated that the capacity of his business is under 100 people, but his concern is Monday thru Thursday closing at 11:00 PM and Friday thru Sunday closing at 12:00 AM. He does not open until 5:00 PM and if this Ordinance is passed the way it is drafted, it will hurt his business along with a lot of other people in the City. Chair stated that the 12:00 closing time has to be really looked at carefully.

Councilman Barone asked Mr. Bouchard what time he gives his last call for drinks. Mr. Bouchard stated 12:45 AM.

Mr. Reedy addressed the Committee again and stated that he opened Mardi Gras in 1989 and cooperation is a wonderful thing. Things can be accomplished fairly easily with cooperation.

Suzanne Arena, 62 Glen View Dr., appeared to speak and stated that for safety, we don't want people on the road. We need to keep businesses in the City. The taxpayers of the City cannot afford to lose businesses in the City.

Matthew Beltrami, Bolten St., appeared to speak regarding Jimmy D's and stated that events such as ringo competitions, bikini competition that go on in the Halo Room at Jimmy D's and questioned if these would fall under a different type of entertainment. Councilman Santamaria stated that this will be addressed. He presented two handouts. Chair stated that he will meet with members of the Administration, Solicitor and Councilman Santamaria and any other members of this Committee and discuss what has been discussed this evening and how this Ordinance can be drafted to make the business owners happy.

Councilman Barone stated to the Chair that, as suggested by Mr. Reedy, he may want to consider having business owners represented at this meeting. Councilman Santamaria stated that he would also like to have two residents attend this meeting also.

Councilman Santamaria presented two handouts, e-mail regarding the Halo Room at Jimmy D's and a copy of Title 3 of State Statute.

On motion by Council President Garabedian, seconded by Councilman Navarro, it was voted to continue this Ordinance. Motion passed unanimously.

Chair stated that he received a letter from Attorney Robert Murray, who represents Cullion Concrete, which is opposed to the use of part of part of his client's property for the bazaar. Solicitor addressed the issue raised by Attorney Murray of the location being 2 Marine Dr., which belongs to his client. Solicitor also stated that Attorney Murray also addresses Section 5.04.090 of the Code seeking to use this property and he stated that he has a concern regarding that. His other concern is that the Code states the Building Official needs to weigh-in and he has not done that. Council President Garabedian stated that there is no such number as 2 Marine Dr. Attorney Murray's client does not own the property on Marine Dr. because their property does not extend to Marine Dr. He also stated that he believes this request would require full Council approval. There have been in the past other organizations that have used City property for fundraising. Solicitor stated that this particular organization has a lawsuit against the City.

Council Member Bucci asked what the raising of money is for. **Suzanne Arena**, appeared to represent Cranston Citizens for Responsible Zoning & Dev. and stated that the money raised would be used for attorney fees and to pay for flyers and notices sent to people. Council Member Bucci stated that if this is approved, it would be almost adding fuel to the fire by having this event on Marine Dr.

Chair stated that his concern is this event would attract a large crowd and he is concerned of where the people are going to park.

Councilman Barone suggested that if the application was filed under the address of the President of the Association, he would not think there would be a problem approving this license. If we are to approve this license under the address of 2 Marine Dr., it would be a conflict because the City has been saying all along that there is no such address.

Discussion took place on the possibility of using the address of the nearby property, which is the City's pumping station.

Council President Garabedian recommended amending the application to state the address of the City property pumping station.

Ms. Arena amended the application to state the address as the City's pumping station property.
