Jennifer Powers and Andrea DeFelippo appeared to speak.

Chair stated that there are Police reports prepared for the Committee of the last two weekends.

Mr. Kirshenbaum stated that after speaking with the Major, the reports demonstrate some very minor problems and there have been no problems since the last meeting.

Major Blackmar stated that he was at this establishment two times and both times it was extremely quiet. Some reports were made, but nothing was found to be in violation.

Chair suggested that the applicant keep dialogue going with the neighbors. If there were violations, the details would continue, but there were no violations.

Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews asked what the status is of soundproofing. Ms. DeFelippo stated that they have looked at placing some material on the walls. After speaking to the neighbors, the general problem seems to be when people leave the establishment. Her engineer has stated to her that to install double doors would be an absolute waste of money. She asked that the Police reports be read into the record. Chair asked for legal opinion. Mr. Kirshenbaum stated that he sees no problem placing the reports into the record, but does not see a need for them to be read into the record.

Melissa and Donald Centracchio, 9 Druid Rd., Warwick, owners of property at 23 Avon St., appeared to speak. Ms. Centracchio addressed the problems with parking, noise from music, band, amplifiers. She asked that there be Police detail permanently.

Mr. Centracchio stated that, as to the double doors, he is an engineer and double doors work wonderful. His tenants have been residents of Pawtuxet Village for 15-20 years now and their quality of life has gone downhill. There is a bar in the middle of residential that is causing disturbance to his property.

Ms. Centracchio stated that she and the residents of this area agree that crowd control outside worked when there was Police detail and they are respectfully requesting that it be continued or suspend the Entertainment License.

Council Vice-President Livingston stated that he walked by this establishment a few Friday nights ago. The first night of the detail, at approximately 8:45 p.m. and he could not believe the noise, and it was very crowded and the door was propped open. He emailed the applicants and advised them of this, but did not receive a response. Ms. DeFelippo stated that at that point, there is no live music. Council Vice-President Livingston stated that even if it was not noisy, leaving the doors open is just giving the residents a reason to complain.

Seth Perlmutter, Esq., appeared to represent the applicant. Eli Antoun also appeared to speak.

Carlos Lopez, Director of Constituent Affairs, appeared to speak and gave status of violations. He stated that on January 7, 2009, he received a call from a constituent of complaints of cars parked illegally and with no plates.

Sharon Cavalloro, Minimum Housing Code Enforcement Officer, appeared to speak and stated that she conducted an inspection of this business today and took pictures and there were lines for parking spaces and there were less cars then prior inspection.

Councilman Navarro asked how and when these issues will be addressed. He has been by this area and there has been no improvement in the last month. Attorney Perlmutter stated that since the last meeting, applicant could not do any work on the site due to the rain. Last week, the contractor drew the parking lines. In terms of the vehicles, he has explained to his client that he must use the spaces that he has and the three bays he has available, and after that he has to make other arrangements. There could be several reasons for the unregistered vehicles, such as there are wholesalers that their cars do not pass inspection and they contract a Getty Station, such as this one, to get the vehicles repaired in order to pass inspection. Then there are people who bring their vehicles to be repaired and they decide they do not want to pay for the repairs.

Councilman Navarro stated that this business is doing full service, he is supposed to be just doing oil changes and tire rotation. If he is having problems with the people, it is the type of people that he is choosing to do business with.

Attorney Perlmutter stated that his client should not be restricted because he feels it is unconstitutional. He should be allowed to conduct the same type of work as other service stations. He asked that this item be continued for another month.

Mr. Kirshenbaum asked Attorney Perlmutter to ask his client to adhere to the site plan.

Chair stated that Captain Palumbo went to this establishment on March 23, 2009 and asked for work orders. The applicant was unable to produce all of them. He questioned why the cars were at the establishment if the applicant did not have work orders. Attorney Perlmutter stated that his client does not have to produce work orders. He does not think any businessman needs to produce a work order without a warrant.

Councilman Navarro motioned to continue this item for one month if parking plan is adhered to and location is not cleaned up, otherwise, next month he will recommend that the license be placed on probation or applicant will be fined. Council Vice-President Livingston seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Mark Gershkoff, Esq., appeared to speak. **Jose Ruiz** also appeared to speak. No one appeared to oppose.

Attorney Gershkoff stated that his client is trying to obtain parking from neighbors at this time.

Chair clarified to the applicant that until there is a valid parking plan, Entertainment will be suspended.

Councilman Archetto asked how many spaces this establishment is looking for. Mr. Ruiz stated that, forty and at this time, he has sixteen.

On motion by Council Vice-President Livingston, seconded by Council President Lanni, it was voted to continue this item for one month. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Pikul appeared to speak and stated that he has a concern regarding the definition of “front yard”. He suggested possibly using language such as “area” could be included in that.

Council President Lanni stated that he understands the intent of the Ordinance, but there is a bigger issue. There is a property rights issue.

Councilman Pelletier indicated that he would like to see amendments to this Ordinance to address the property rights issue. He suggested the following amendment: Section A, line 31, after the word “shall”, delete “not” and after the word “front”, add “of said dwelling as parking spaces is outlined....”.

Councilman Navarro asked Mr. Pikul to come up with an amendment which he feels it would work in light of Council President Lanni’s concern.

Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews stated that passing this Ordinance may be a burdensome cost to the property owner.

Councilman Archetto stated that he understands the intent of this Ordinance, but it would be a bit intrusive on the property owners.

Councilman Navarro asked for Solicitor’s opinion regarding the property rights issue and asked if we would be in violation if this Ordinance is passed. Mr. Kirshenbaum stated that this would fall more under Minimum Housing as to aesthetics and neighborhood concerns.

Councilman Lupino stated that before this Ordinance is passed, we need to look at how the components are defined in the Zoning Ordinance. The Ordinance needs to address hardship cases, cases of an emergency nature. Enforcement also needs to be considered.

Councilman Pelletier withdrew his motion to amend.

On motion by Councilman Pelletier, seconded by Councilman Navarro, it was voted to recommend approval of this Ordinance. Motion passed on a vote of 4-3. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilmen Santamaria, Pelletier, Navarro and Council Vice-President Livingston -4. The following being recorded as voting “nay”: Councilman Archetto, Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews and Council President Lanni -3.

Council Vice-President Livingston appeared to speak and stated that he is concerned that this will have a chilling effect on people who call who have valid Code violations. He likes the intent of this Ordinance, but he will not support it.

Councilman Archetto stated that harassment and nuisance is already addressed in the Code.

Councilman Navarro asked for legal opinion on whether this would be infringing on the rights of the people and he also questioned why there is no endorsement from the Solicitor. Mr. Kirshenbaum stated that he would be in the negative endorsement because it would put the person issuing the ticket in a difficult situation and would be hard to prove the allegation.

Councilman Pelletier motioned to recommend approval of this Ordinance. Councilman Navarro seconded the motion for discussion purposes.

Under Discussion:

Councilman Navarro stated that based on the Solicitor opinion, to add another layer is not needed.

Roll call was taken on motion to recommend approval of this Ordinance and motion failed on a vote of 1-6. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilman Pelletier -1. The following being recorded as voting “nay”: Councilmen Santamaria, Archetto, Navarro, Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews, Council Vice-President Livingston and Council President Lanni -6.
