Gregory Thompson, 41 Kneeland St., appeared to speak as an abutting property owner. He asked what the reason is for this type of license request. He stated that Rhodes is an event venue. They have a Class J License and in the past, they have not been good neighbors. The property value of his home has been impacted by this business. There have been continuing problems at this business and there is no reason for this type of license for outdoor service. He and his neighbors do not want this license approved.

William Grimes, Operations Manager, appeared to speak in favor.

Council President Lanni asked where on the property the alcohol will be served. Mr. Grimes stated, to the right as you come down to the parking lot.

Aaron Massir appeared to speak in favor and stated that service would also be to the immediate area outside of the building, near the gazebo and grass area.

He feels the problems that occurred years ago at this establishment have dramatically declined mainly due to this Committee keeping an eye on what is going on there. He was advised by the Clerk that the reason for this request was for weddings. If it is for that, when there are weddings, the establishment can come before this Committee and request for a license for that particular event if they want to serve outdoors, but to expand the premises to allow alcohol outdoors, he does not think it is needed and they can obtain a one day license for a particular event.

Council Vice-President Livingston motioned to deny this license application.
Councilman Aceto seconded the motion.

Under Discussion:

Councilwoman Bergin-Andrews asked if it would be possible to get a license strictly just limited to weddings and strictly to a time period. Council President Lanni stated that the Expansion of Premises license does not limit the use just for weddings, it could be used for other events. This is why he does not like this idea. The applicant has the option to apply for a license to serve outdoors per event.

Motion to deny this license application passed unanimously.

Mr. Grimes stated that the reason for this request was to serve alcohol outdoors for a cocktail hour at weddings.
