

REGULAR MEETING – CITY COUNCIL

-OCTOBER 27, 2003-

Regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Cranston was held on Monday, October 27, 2003.

The meeting was called to order in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 7:05 P.M. by the Council President.

Roll Call showed the following members present: Councilmen Fung, Jackvony, Councilwoman O’Hara, Council Member Fogarty, Councilwoman McFarland (appeared at 7:10 P.M.), Councilmen Ferolito, Lanni, McDonough and Council President Pastore – 9.

Also Present: Paul Grimes, Director of Administration; Robin Muksian-Schutt, Deputy Director of Administration; Evan Kirshenbaum, Assistant City Solicitor; Mike Igoe, City Controller; Pat Quinlan, City Council Legal Counsel.

Councilman Fung led the Pledge of Allegiance. Council President Pastore asked for a moment of silent prayer for the people in California, who are experiencing wildfires and for the people in the military.

Minutes of the last meeting were dispensed with and stand approved as recorded.

I. PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND COMMENDATIONS

II. INTRODUCTION OF UNDOCKETED RESOLUTIONS

“RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING OCTOBER, 2003 AS CRIME PREVENTION MONTH”

Council President Pastore stated that this will be discussed and voted on under Section VII of the Docket.

III. EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

Mr. Grimes addressed legal costs paid in Fiscal Year 2002-2003 and year end transfers and how the year end transfers are done. He stated that it is normal for the Finance Department to close out the previous Fiscal Year by September 1. Fiscal Year ends June 30, invoices and other expenses that should be accrued to the just ended Fiscal Year are accounted for. He stated that the Administration has recently been made aware of a typographical error in the Charter regarding transfers, which Council President Pastore was made aware of by the City Clerk prior to the Administration being notified. The Administration has asked the Solicitor to review this.

Mr. Grimes stated that the Administration has not overspent its legal budget. The budget for legal costs was originally \$331,000 for Fiscal Year 2002-2003. The budget was amended and \$150,000 was added to the Law Department for outside labor relations.

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After review of legal costs by the this Administration, \$1.2 million was incurred by the O'Leary Administration. This Administration was not aware that \$321,000 in unpaid legal bills made by the O'Leary Administration were waiting in the hopper. The Administration would be willing to share any information with the Council in more detail in follow-up meetings. The Administration fully expects to run a surplus for Fiscal Year 2002-2003. Mr. Grimes stated that a legal expense analysis has been prepared to be submitted to the Council on a bi-monthly basis. He stated that the Administration is proposing weekly legal meetings in Executive Session starting this Friday morning.

Council President Pastore addressed the statement Mr. Grimes made that Council President Pastore found an error in the Charter. He stated that this is not true and that he would not stand for Chicago-type politics. He and the City Clerk never spoke regarding any error in the Charter. Ms. Wall agreed. Council President Pastore stated that in June, he did advise the Mayor, verbally, on this issue. He stated that he is appalled that his integrity was questioned on something of this magnitude.

Councilman Lanni addressed the statement made by Mr. Grimes of having meetings on Friday mornings. He stated that most of the Council members have jobs and cannot attend meetings during the day. He would rather come in on a Saturday or Sunday.

Council President Pastore stated that the legal expenses could be discussed in the Finance Committee in Executive Session with all Council members invited to attend.

Council Member Fogarty stated that she did review the legal bills and she found the bills to be offensive, because we have no idea of how the bills were billable. Mr. Kirshenbaum stated that perhaps, the particular attorney in question could appear before the Council to explain the nature of the work that is being undertaken. Councilwoman O'Hara stated that to initially get the Council updated, we should use a different format. Council President Pastore suggested a Special Council meeting. He stated that the first meeting will be Monday, November 3 at 5:00 PM. in Executive Session.

Mr. Quinlan stated that in December, he and then Solicitor Brody met with Solicitor Alston and she was told that the Budget had a positive balance and the Council asked for updates on the Budget and as of yet, they have not received it. The Council has been asking the Administration for legal fees reports from January.

Ms. Wall stated that the Section of the Charter in question is Section 6.16. On August 22, Attorney Quinlan contacted her regarding this Section and the wording somehow was changed by the publisher. She and Council President Pastore never had any discussion on this. After she and Mr. Quinlan discussed this, she then sent a memo to the Solicitor explaining this error. Mr. Quinlan stated that the issue the Council is trying to deal with and resolve is Section 6.18 of the Charter.

IV. COUNCIL PRESIDENT COMMUNICATIONS

Council President Pastore stated that Mr. Quinlan sent the Council members correspondence regarding the error in the Charter and asked that he speak regarding this. Mr. Quinlan stated that he made a suggestion regarding Section 6.18 of the Charter. He is recommending that the Council not move on that motion until they have a clear factual record of what was spent, who spent it and who authorized it until the Council gets a legal opinion as to the status either by the Attorney General or a Court. Councilman Fung asked how far back do we go on this fact finding. Mr. Quinlan stated he does not know the answer, but this is a very good question for fact finding. Council President Pastore stated that we ask the Attorney General to review this and give us their advise on whether the Council can approve these transfers. He asked Mr. Quinlan to ask for a directive from the Attorney General's Office and then we can have a Council meeting to review the

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findings. Councilman Fung inquired as to the basis for the opinion and stated that he does not believe the Attorney General can give an opinion on this. Mr. Quinlan stated that we can ask the Attorney General's Office if he is willing to render an opinion. There is a history of their rendering opinions at the request of a public official.

Council President Pastore asked that Councilman Jackvony and Councilwoman McFarland meet with Mr. Grimes to review the benefits package for the Administrative Unit. Council President commented the rate of 1st quarter collections and expenditures.

Council President Pastore stated that the Audit Committee has made a selection for the position of the City Council's Internal Auditor and this selection will be voted on under "Election of City Officials" of the Docket.

Mr. Igoe stated that we have started a monthly **quarter (or quarterly?)** tax report to the Department of Municipal Affairs. He stated that there is an additional \$554,000 in State Revenue, a portion of this was used to increase legal expenditures.

V. COUNCIL MEMBER COMMUNICATIONS

Councilman McDonough asked how much we are paying Attorney Steven Robinson per hour. Mr. Kirshenbaum stated that he does not have Attorney Robinson's agreement with him but will obtain this information.

Council Member Fogarty asked that Mr. Kirshenbaum follow up on the following: Olen & Penza bills that were paid twice and an hourly detailed report on the bills.

Councilwoman McFarland asked how the Administration plans on handling graffiti on public buildings and the bike path and City's right of ways. Mr. Grimes stated that we will get to them as soon as we can.

VI. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Ben Nascenzi, Building Inspector, appeared to speak regarding Ordinance 6-03-2. He stated that this Ordinance streamlines the process. He urged the Council to adopt this Ordinance.

Jack Rich, 26 Harvard Court, appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 6-03-2.

Marilyn Mulholland, 66 Eastern Ave., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 6-03-2.

Barry Mulholland, 66 Eastern Ave., appeared to speak in favor of Ordinance 6-03-2.

Patrick Keough, 205 Aquaduct Rd., appeared to speak regarding recreational fields being inundated with pet owners enclosing them in the fields and not picking up their feces. Councilwoman McFarland stated that she sponsored an Ordinance last year on behalf of Major McGrath violating pet owners who do not pick up after their pets and she suggested that Mr. Keough contact Major McGrath and speak to him regarding this problem. Mr. Grimes stated that he will confer with Major McGrath and Ms. Schutt will obtain Mr. Keough's phone number and try to resolve this.

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Aram Garabedian, 173 Belvedere Dr., appeared to speak regarding Ordinance 6-03-2. He thinks this is generally a good Ordinance but had some concerns as to the impact on signs and parking. Councilwoman O'Hara questioned what the position of the Planning Commission is regarding Ordinance 6-03-2, since any requests for variances are reviewed by the Planning staff. Council President Pastore read the Planning Commission's recommendation regarding this Ordinance.

Paul Valetta, President of Firefighters Local 1363, appeared to speak regarding Ordinance 8-03-2 and stated that this could be in violation of bargaining in good faith.

Anthony Lupino, 15 Black Oak Court, appeared to speak and stated that the City of Warwick funds the Schools approximately \$30 million more than the City of Cranston.

Jim Davies, 19 Quail Ridge Rd., appeared to speak and asked Mr. Quinlan what the question is that he thinks the Attorney General is going to resolve for the City. Mr. Quinlan stated that the questions would be, "can the City Council approve appropriations made in violation of Section 6.18 of the Charter"?

Albert Benetti, 24 Concord Ave., appeared to speak regarding legal fees transfers. He stated that the Council needs to go back to the previous Administration and hold everyone accountable.

Jeffrey Kelly, 26 Mystery Farms Dr., appeared to speak. He stated that he would like to know tonight, exactly how much money has been expended and there should be a resolution tonight from the City Council to investigate.

Paul Valetta, President of Firefighters Local 1363, updated the Council on the Court case. He stated the Mayor's comments were misleading, that at this point, they are in arbitration, which is exactly what the union had initially proposed. He questioned Mr. Grimes on whether he recalled negotiations the City had with the Fire Union. Mr. Grimes stated, yes, they did. Mr. Valetta pointed out various concession proposals the Fire Union made to the City and the Mayor stated in the paper the other day that the Fire Union did not offer any concessions to the City. Mr. Grimes stated the concessions they were going to give up would make the proposed cuts minimal.

Aram Garabedian appeared to speak regarding the City Council Internal Auditor position.

Steve Callahan, 125 Amanda St., appeared to speak regarding a letter sent to the residents from the Administration regarding sewer backups. He stated that he met with the Director of Public Works and told him that he spoke to his attorney and was told the City cannot go back in years to enforce an Ordinance. Councilman McDonough asked that this issue and the letter sent to the residents be placed on the next Public Works Agenda.

Council President Pastore asked if there were any objections to hearing this Resolution. No one objected.

“RESOLUTION TO STUDY SPRINGFIELD, MASSACHUSETTS’ PRESCRIPTION DRUG PLAN.”

Councilman Ferolito asked to speak as a constituent and abstained from voting on this Resolution, though he did not feel he had a conflict. He stated a concern he has with this Resolution is safety issue if something happened to a senior or a City employee who gets the drugs from Canada. Councilman Lanni stated that this is just a study. This is a well-worth idea to look into. Councilman Fung stated a concern is a potential for any types of suits. Mr. Grimes stated he and Mr. Baron met with the City’s healthcare consultant and this subject came up and they are looking at this matter and researching it. He invited Councilman McDonough to sit in at the next meeting that will be held with the healthcare consultant.

On motion by Councilman McDonough, seconded by Councilwoman McFarland, the above Resolution was adopted on a vote of 6-2 with 1 abstention. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilwoman O’Hara, Council Member Fogarty, Councilwoman McFarland, Councilmen Lanni, McDonough and Council President Pastore –6. The following being recorded as voting “nay”: Councilmen Fung and Jackvony –2. Councilman Ferolito abstained.

Councilman Jackvony asked that a meeting be scheduled where the Council can meet with the Audit Committee to discuss the salary and benefits and the reason why they recommend Mr. Woerner. Councilwoman O'Hara stated that Ordinance 10-03-2 is creating the Internal Auditor position, which will be heard before the Finance Committee and Ordinance Committee and Mr. Woerner and members of the Audit Committee could be asked to appear before the Finance Committee meeting.
